AN ACT

- Amending Title 74 (Transportation) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in public-private transportation 2 partnerships, further providing for definitions, for duties 3 of board and for operation of board; and voiding prior initiatives of the Public-Private Transportation Partnership 5 Board. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. The definition of "public-private transportation 10 partnership agreement" in section 9102 of Title 74 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is 11 12 amended by adding a definition to read: 13 § 9102. Definitions. The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 14 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

18 "Public-private transportation partnership agreement." A

context clearly indicates otherwise:

19 contract for a transportation project which transfers the rights

- 1 for the use or control, in whole or in part, of a transportation
- 2 facility by a public entity to a development entity for a
- 3 definite term during which the development entity will provide
- 4 the transportation project to the public entity in return for
- 5 the right to receive all or a portion of the revenue generated
- 6 from the use of the transportation facility, or other payment,
- 7 such as the following [transportation-related services]:
- 8 (1) Operations and maintenance.
- 9 (2) Revenue collection.
- 10 (3) User fee collection or enforcement.
- 11 (4) Design.
- 12 (5) Construction.
- 13 (6) Development and other activities with respect to
- existing or new transportation facilities that enhance
- traffic throughput, reduce congestion, improve safety or
- otherwise manage or improve a transportation facility.

- "Transportation-related service." A proposed or existing
- 20 service offered by the department or a Commonwealth agency to
- 21 provide a product, permit or similar authorization in a
- 22 transaction for a resident or nonresident to move individuals or

- Section 2. Section 9104(a)(4) and (c) of Title 74 are

- 27 (a) Duties. -- The board shall do all of the following:
- 28 * * *
- 29 (4) Evaluate and, where the board finds that the
- 30 requests or plans for transportation projects are in the best

- 1 interests of the Commonwealth and a public entity, approve
- the requests or plans for transportation projects[. The board
- 3 shall approve a proposed transportation project by adopting a
- 4 resolution.] <u>as provided under section 9105.</u>

- 6 [(c) General Assembly. -- The following shall apply:
- 7 (1) The General Assembly may, within 20 calendar days or
- 8 nine legislative days, whichever is longer, of the adoption
- of the resolution under subsection (a)(4), pass a concurrent
- resolution rescinding the approval of a transportation
- project if the transportation facility which is the subject
- of the transportation project is owned by the Commonwealth.
- (2) If the General Assembly adopts the concurrent
- resolution within the time period under paragraph (1) by
- majority vote in both the Senate and the House of
- Representatives, the transportation project shall be deemed
- disapproved.

- 27 (b) Analysis. -- The following shall apply:
- 28 <u>(1)</u> The department shall develop a detailed analysis of
- 29 a request or recommendation <u>for a transportation project</u>
- 30 prior to approval by the board.

Τ	(2) The analysis shall include the following:
2	(i) The exact location of the proposed
3	transportation project.
4	(ii) The type of transportation facility or
5	transportation-related service to be improved.
6	(iii) The estimated costs of the transportation
7	project to the public entity.
8	(iv) The estimated length of the public-private
9	transportation partnership agreement.
10	(v) The social, economic and environmental impacts
11	of the transportation project.
12	(vi) If the proposed transportation project will
13	include a public-private transportation partnership
14	agreement, include the estimated amount and type of user
15	<u>fees.</u>
16	(vii) Applicable Federal and State laws.
17	(2.1) The department may conduct additional evaluations
18	prior to the development of the analysis.
19	(3) The department shall post a copy of the analysis on
20	the department's publicly accessible Internet website, submit
21	the analysis to the board and the chairperson and minority
22	chairperson of the Transportation Committee of the Senate and
23	the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
24	Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives and
25	transmit notice of the analysis to the Legislative Reference
26	Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin for 30
27	days prior to any action by the board.
28	(b.1) Public input The department shall collect comments
29	from the public on the proposed transportation project during a
30	<pre>public comment period which shall commence with the publication</pre>

- 1 of the notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the analysis and
- 2 <u>shall continue for a period of not less than 30 days. Prior to</u>
- 3 any action by the board, the department shall post a copy of the
- 4 results on the department's publicly accessible Internet website
- 5 and submit the results to the board and the chairperson and
- 6 minority chairperson of the Transportation Committee of the
- 7 <u>Senate and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the</u>
- 8 Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 9 (b.2) Evaluation and approval. -- The following shall apply:
- 10 (1) After consideration of the analysis and public
- input, if the board finds that the transportation project is
- in the best interests of the Commonwealth, it may approve the
- 13 <u>transportation project.</u>
- 14 (2) The board shall approve a proposed transportation
- project by adopting a resolution with or without a user fee.
- A copy of the resolution shall be posted on the department's
- 17 publicly accessible Internet website and shall be transmitted
- 18 by the department to the following entities within 24 hours
- 19 after approval:
- 20 (i) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 21 <u>Transportation Committee of the Senate and the</u>
- 22 chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 23 Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 24 (ii) The Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 25 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 26 (b.3) Transportation projects without user fee.--The
- 27 <u>following shall apply for a transportation project without a</u>
- 28 user fee:
- 29 (1) The General Assembly may pass a concurrent
- 30 resolution rescinding the approval of a transportation

1	project without a user fee if the transportation facility
2	which is the subject of the transportation project is owned
3	by the Commonwealth through the following procedure:
4	(i) Either chamber of the General Assembly may
5	initiate a concurrent resolution under this paragraph. If
6	the chamber of origin passes a concurrent resolution, the
7	chamber of reference must within 10 calendar days or five
8	legislative days, pass the concurrent resolution. The
9	passage of a concurrent resolution by a majority vote in
10	both chambers may not collectively exceed 20 calendar
11	days or 10 legislative days of the resolution being
12	published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, whichever is
13	<pre>longer.</pre>
14	(ii) If the period of 20 calendar days or 10
15	legislative days, whichever is longer, under subparagraph
16	(i) expires before a session of the General Assembly
17	adjourns sine die, the General Assembly shall have 20
18	calendar days or 10 legislative days, whichever is
19	longer, starting on the first day of succeeding session
20	of the General Assembly.
21	(2) If the General Assembly adopts the concurrent
22	resolution within the time period under paragraph (1),
23	proceeded by presentment to the Governor, the transportation
24	project without a user fee shall be deemed disapproved.
25	(3) If the General Assembly fails to adopt the
26	concurrent resolution within the time period under paragraph
27	(1), the transportation project without a user fee shall be
28	deemed approved and the public entity may proceed with the
29	<pre>public-private transportation partnership agreement.</pre>

4 General Assembly passes a concurrent resolution approving the

user fee, the project shall be deemed disapproved unless the

5 <u>transportation project with a user fee.</u>

(2) The General Assembly may pass a concurrent resolution approving a transportation project with a user fee if the transportation facility which is the subject of the transportation project is owned by the Commonwealth through the following procedure:

(i) Either chamber of the General Assembly may initiate a concurrent resolution under this paragraph. If the chamber of origin passes a concurrent resolution, the chamber of reference must within 45 calendar days or 10 legislative days, pass the concurrent resolution. The passage of a concurrent resolution by a majority vote in both chambers may not collectively exceed 90 calendar days or 20 legislative days of the resolution being published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, whichever is longer.

(ii) If the period of 90 calendar days or 20

legislative days, whichever is longer, under subparagraph

(i) expires before a session of the General Assembly

adjourns sine die, the General Assembly shall have 90

calendar days or 20 legislative days, whichever is

longer, starting on the first day of succeeding session

of the General Assembly.

(iii) If the General Assembly adopts the concurrent resolution within the time period under paragraph (i) or (ii), proceeded by presentment to the Governor, the

1	transportation project with a user fee shall be deemed					
2	approved and the public entity may proceed with the					
3	public-private transportation partnership agreement.					
4	(iv) If the General Assembly fails to adopt the					
5	concurrent resolution within the time period under					
6	paragraph (i) or (ii), the transportation project with a					
7	user fee shall remain disapproved.					
8	(v) Nothing in this section shall be construed to					
9	prevent a proposed transportation project with a user fee					
10	that was disapproved under subparagraph (iv) from being					
11	resubmitted to the board.

13	Section 4. The amendment of 74 Pa.C.S. § 9105 shall apply to					
14	resolutions considered after October 31, 2020, by the Public-					
15	Private Transportation Partnership Board. Any resolution					
16	considered after October 31, 2020, and prior to the effective					
17	date of this section by the Public-Private Transportation					
18	Partnership Board, including the resolution authorizing the					
19	PennDOT Pathways Major Bridge P3 Initiative, shall be void and					
20	must be reconsidered by the Public-Private Transportation					
21	Partnership Board.					
22	Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
