AN ACT

Amending Title 74 (Transportation) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in public-private transportation 2 partnerships, further providing for definitions, for duties 3 of board and for operation of board; and voiding prior initiatives of the Public-Private Transportation Partnership 5 Board. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. The definition of "public-private transportation 10 partnership agreement" in section 9102 of Title 74 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is 11 12 amended by adding a definition to read: 13 § 9102. Definitions. - 18 Section 4. The amendment of 74 Pa.C.S. § 9105 shall apply to
- 19 resolutions considered after October 31, 2020, by the Public-

- 22 date of this section by the Public-Private Transportation
- 23 Partnership Board, including the resolution authorizing the
