## AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, prohibiting certain regulatory action during disaster emergencies. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 7 § 7309. Regulatory action during disaster emergencies 8 9 prohibited. (a) Applicability. -- This section shall apply during the 10 period of a declaration by the Governor of a disaster emergency 11 under section 7301(c) (relating to general authority of 12 Governor) and notwithstanding any other provision of law. 1.3 14 (b) Regulations. -- The following are prohibited, unless the 15 action is directly related to responding to the disaster emergency or adhering to a Federal or State statutory timeline 16 17 or court order:

(1) Consideration, adoption or publication within the

2	regulation or a final-omitted regulation subject to the act
3	of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory
4	Review Act.
5	(2) Conducting a department or agency advisory committee
6	meeting.
7	(c) Waiver
8	(1) A Commonwealth agency may petition to the
9	appropriate standing committees of the Senate and House of
10	Representatives under section 7(d) of the Regulatory Review
11	Act for a waiver of the prohibition under subsection (b). The
12	<pre>petition must:</pre>
13	(i) Be in writing.
14	(ii) Be signed by the head of the Commonwealth
15	agency or its governing body.
16	(iii) State the compelling reason why a waiver
17	should be granted.
18	(iv) Be submitted to the chair of each standing
19	committee for distribution to the respective members of
20	the committee.
21	(2) A waiver under paragraph (1) shall be granted upon a
22	majority vote of each standing committee.
23	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
