## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pennsylvania Commission on African American
- 2 Affairs, the Pennsylvania Commission on Asian Pacific
- 3 American Affairs, the Pennsylvania Commission on Latino
- 4 Affairs, the Pennsylvania Commission on LGBTQ Affairs and the
- 5 Pennsylvania Commission on Women; establishing the
- 6 Commonwealth Commissions Fund; and providing for powers and
- 7 duties.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Short title.
- 11 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Commonwealth
- 12 Commissions Act.
- 13 Section 2. Definitions.
- 14 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 15 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 16 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 17 "Commission." A commission established under section 3(a).
- 18 "Fund." The Commonwealth Commissions Fund established under
- 19 section 3.
- 20 Section 3. Establishment of independent commissions.

- 1 (a) Establishment.--The following independent commissions
- 2 are established:
- 3 (1) The Pennsylvania Commission on African American
- 4 Affairs.
- 5 (2) The Pennsylvania Commission on Asian Pacific
- 6 American Affairs.
- 7 (3) The Pennsylvania Commission on Latino Affairs.
- 8 (4) The Pennsylvania Commission on LGBTQ Affairs.
- 9 (5) The Pennsylvania Commission on Women.
- 10 (b) Membership. -- Subject to subsection (f), each commission
- 11 shall consist of 40 individuals who must reside in this
- 12 Commonwealth appointed as follows:
- 13 (1) Eight individuals by the Governor.
- 14 (2) Eight individuals by the Majority Leader of the
- 15 Senate.
- 16 (3) Eight individuals by the Minority Leader of the
- 17 Senate.
- 18 (4) Eight individuals by the Majority Leader of the
- 19 House of Representatives.
- 20 (5) Eight individuals by the Minority Leader of the
- 21 House of Representatives.
- 22 (c) Specific membership requirements. -- Each appointing
- 23 authority under subsection (b) shall appoint to each commission,
- 24 subject to subsection (f), at least one individual under 29
- 25 years of age, one individual 65 years of age or older, one
- 26 individual who is an educational professional and one individual
- 27 who is a health care professional. No active member of the
- 28 Senate or House of Representatives may serve on any commission
- 29 established under subsection (a).
- 30 (d) Diversity.--All members of each commission shall be

- 1 drawn from diverse racial, ethnic, religious, age, sexual
- 2 orientation, gender identity and socioeconomic backgrounds in
- 3 this Commonwealth.
- 4 (e) Term and vacancy. -- Each member of each commission under
- 5 subsection (a) shall serve a term of two years, beginning on
- 6 the first legislative day of each new regular session of the
- 7 General Assembly. A member may serve for a period longer than
- 8 two years until their successor is appointed. An appointment to
- 9 the commissions may be selected beginning December 1 of each
- 10 year prior to the start of a new regular legislative session. A
- 11 member of each commission may be removed from the commission
- 12 with a two-thirds vote of all then-currently serving
- 13 commissioners. A vacancy in the membership of a commission shall
- 14 be filled by the original appointing authority for the balance
- 15 of the unexpired term.
- 16 (f) Civic organization. -- An appointment to a commission
- 17 under subsection (a) shall be made in consultation with civic
- 18 organizations incorporated in this Commonwealth that are
- 19 stakeholders related to the mission of each commission. A
- 20 nomination to each commission shall be solicited between
- 21 September 1 and November 1 of each year preceding the start of a
- 22 new session of the General Assembly through an open application
- 23 process using a uniform application that is widely distributed
- 24 throughout this Commonwealth by the Office of Administration.
- 25 Each appointing authority shall select among the eligible
- 26 candidates who have completed the application.
- 27 (g) Chairperson. -- Each commission shall elect a chairperson
- 28 at the start of each regular term from among its members. The
- 29 chairperson of each commission may designate one or more
- 30 commission members as vice chairs of the commission. The

- 1 chairperson, or a majority of members of each commission, may
- 2 create advisory committees on important sectors of policy such
- 3 as education, health care, human services, workforce
- 4 development, rural concerns, older adults or youths and appoint
- 5 members of the commission as chairs of the advisory committees
- 6 and members for the advisory committees. In the event of a
- 7 vacancy of a chair, the executive director of each commission or
- 8 a representative from the Office of Administration shall serve
- 9 as an interim chairperson.
- 10 (h) Meetings.--Each commission shall meet quarterly in
- 11 person. If an in-person meeting is not practical as designated
- 12 by either an order of the Governor, an equivalent individual or
- 13 the commission chair, a virtual meeting shall be acceptable.
- 14 (i) Compensation. -- The members of each commission may
- 15 receive no compensation for services, but shall be reimbursed
- 16 for any usual and customary expenses incurred in the performance
- 17 of commission duties through the Office of Administration.
- 18 (j) Mission.--Each commission's mission shall be to issue
- 19 recommendations on policies, procedures, legislation and
- 20 regulations that affect the communities each commission
- 21 represents on an ongoing basis to the Governor, the General
- 22 Assembly, various State agencies and departments. The following
- 23 shall apply:
- 24 (1) Each commission's mission shall include
- investigation of the use of resources from both the public
- and private sectors to enhance and improve the ability of
- 27 State agencies to provide services to the communities in this
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 (2) Each commission shall:
- 30 (i) Serve as a resource for community organizations

- 1 and provide forums for developing strategies and programs 2 that will expand and enhance the civic, social, 3 educational, cultural and economic status of the communities in this Commonwealth.
  - Work in partnership with various Federal, State (ii) and local agencies and departments to promote communitybased programs focusing on urgent issues impacting this Commonwealth.
  - Annually, on or before June 1 of each year, (iii) report the results of its findings and activities of the preceding year and make recommendations relating to the concerns of residents of this Commonwealth to the Governor, the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives for distribution to members of the General Assembly.
  - Each commission may identify programs, scholarships, mentoring programs, sources of funding or other resources for the benefit and advancement of the communities in this Commonwealth.
    - (k) Powers and duties. -- Each commission shall be able to:
- 21 Use voluntary and uncompensated services of private 22 individuals, agencies and organizations that may from time to 23 time be offered or required.
- 24 Recommend policies and make recommendations to 25 agencies and officers of the Commonwealth and local 26 subdivisions of government to effectuate the purposes of 27 this act.
  - (3) Subject to appropriation:
- 29 (i) select an executive director and acquire adequate staff to perform the duties of each commission; 30

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- 1 and
- 2 (ii) establish and maintain offices that the 3 commission considers necessary.
- 4 (4) Enact bylaws for governance of each commission.
- 5 (5) Hold regular public meetings and fact-finding
- 6 hearings or other public forums as each commission considers
- 7 necessary.
- 8 (1) Administrative support. -- The executive director of each
- 9 commission shall be based in the Office of Administration and
- 10 shall receive administrative supplies and support through the
- 11 Office of Administration.
- 12 (m) Assistance and appropriation. -- The Commonwealth
- 13 Commissions Fund is established in the State Treasury. The
- 14 General Assembly may appropriate money to the fund for the
- 15 purpose of this act. Each commission may request information and
- 16 assistance as needed from any State agency as the commission may
- 17 require. Each commission may accept and solicit funds, including
- 18 any gifts, donations, grants or bequests or any Federal funds
- 19 for deposit in the fund.
- 20 Section 4. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
