AN ACT

- 1 Providing for cytomegalovirus education and newborn screening.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Short title.
- 5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the CMV Education
- 6 and Newborn Screening Act.
- 7 Section 2. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Birthing facility." An inpatient or ambulatory health care
- 12 facility licensed by the department that provides birthing and
- 13 newborn care services.
- "Certified-nurse midwife." An individual licensed by
- 15 the State Board of Medicine to practice midwifery under section
- 16 35 of the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as

- 1 the Medical Practice Act of 1985.
- 2 "CMV." Cytomegalovirus.
- 3 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 4 "Direct-entry midwife." An independent practitioner educated
- 5 in the discipline of midwifery through self-study,
- 6 apprenticeship, a midwifery school or a college or university-
- 7 based program distinct from the discipline of nursing. The term
- 8 includes certified professional midwives, traditional midwives,
- 9 Amish, Mennonite or Plain midwives and other specific cultural
- 10 or spiritual community-based midwives not licensed by the State
- 11 Board of Medicine as a certified-nurse midwife.
- 12 "Health care practitioner." The term shall have the same
- 13 meaning as defined in section 103 of the act of July 19, 1979
- 14 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- "Newborn child." A child under 21 days of age.
- 16 Section 3. Informational publications by department.
- 17 (a) General rule. -- The department shall make the following
- 18 available on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 19 website:
- 20 (1) Up-to-date, evidence-based information about CMV
- 21 that has been reviewed by medical experts and national CMV
- organizations. The information provided shall include the
- 23 following:
- 24 (i) The incidence of CMV.
- 25 (ii) The transmission of CMV to pregnant women and
- women who may become pregnant.
- 27 (iii) Birth defects caused by congenital CMV.
- 28 (iv) Methods of diagnosing congenital CMV.
- 29 (v) Available preventive measures.
- 30 (vi) Treatment options.

- 1 (vii) Any other information the department deems
- 2 necessary.
- 3 (2) Contact information regarding support programs and
- 4 services, including the following:
- 5 (i) Information hotlines specific to CMV.
- 6 (ii) Relevant resource centers or clearinghouses.
- 7 (iii) National and local CMV organizations.
- 8 (iv) Educational and support programs.
- 9 (b) Form. -- The information provided in accordance with this
- 10 act shall conform to the applicable standard or standards
- 11 provided in the enhanced "National Standards for Culturally and
- 12 Linguistically Appropriate Services in Health and Health Care,"
- 13 as adopted by the United States Department of Health and Human
- 14 Services and published in the Federal Register on September 24,
- 15 2013.
- 16 Section 4. Dissemination of information on CMV.
- 17 (a) Requirement. -- A certified nurse midwife, direct entry
- 18 midwife or health care practitioner that assumes responsibility
- 19 for the prenatal care of a pregnant woman or a woman who may
- 20 become pregnant shall provide the educational information
- 21 regarding CMV made available by the department under section 3.
- 22 (b) Compliance. -- Delivery of information prepared by the
- 23 department in accordance with section 3 shall constitute
- 24 compliance with this section.
- 25 Section 5. CMV newborn screening.
- 26 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided for in subsection
- 27 (c), the department shall require a birthing facility or a
- 28 certified-nurse midwife, direct-entry midwife or health care
- 29 practitioner that assumes care of a newborn child to screen the
- 30 newborn child for CMV before the newborn child is 21 days of age

- 1 if:
- 2 (1) the newborn child fails the initial newborn hearing
- 3 screening under the act of November 30, 2001 (P.L.849,
- 4 No.89), known as the Infant Hearing Education, Assessment,
- 5 Reporting and Referral (IHEARR) Act; or
- 6 (2) the parent or guardian of a newborn child requests
- 7 that the newborn child be screened for CMV.
- 8 (b) Screening. -- A CMV screening shall be performed using the
- 9 following:
- 10 (1) polymerase chain reaction (PCR) on saliva or urine;
- 11 (2) follow-up urine test to a positive PCR saliva test
- 12 for confirmation; or
- (3) successor testing approved by the Centers for <--
- 14 Disease Control and Prevention.
- 15 (3) TESTING APPROVED ON OR BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF <--
- 16 THIS SECTION BY:
- 17 (I) THE DEPARTMENT; OR
- 18 (II) THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.
- 19 (c) Exception. -- A screening under subsection (a) may not be
- 20 performed if a parent or quardian of the newborn child dissents
- 21 on the grounds that the screening conflicts with a religious
- 22 belief or practice.
- 23 Section 6. Regulations.
- 24 The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to
- 25 effectuate the provisions of this act.
- 26 Section 7. Effective date.
- 27 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
