13	display fireworks in a sum not less than \$500 conditioned for
14	the payment of all damages which may be caused to a person or
15	property by reason of the fireworks display and arising from any
16	acts of the permittee or the permittee's agents, employees or
17	subcontractors.
18	<u>§ 1103. Permit extension.</u>
19	The following apply:
20	(1) If unfavorable weather causes a fireworks display
21	for which a permit has been granted not to take place at the
22	time authorized, the person who holds a permit for the
23	display may within 24 hours apply to the governing body of a
24	municipality which granted the permit for an extension of the
25	permit.
26	(2) The application under paragraph (1) shall attest
27	that the fireworks display did not occur, provide the reasons
28	why the display did not occur and request a continuance of
29	the permit for a day designated in the permit no later than
30	one week after the day fixed originally in the permit.

1	(3) Upon receiving an application under paragraph (1),
2	if the governing body of the municipality concludes that the
3	facts in the application are true, the governing body of the
4	municipality shall extend the provisions of the permit to the
5	day designated in the application. The extension of time
6	shall be granted without the payment of an additional fee and
7	without requiring a bond other than the bond under section
8	1102 (relating to bond requirement). The bond under section
9	1102 shall extend to and cover all damages which may be
10	caused by reason of the fireworks display taking place at the
11	extended date in the same manner and to the same extent as if
12	the display had taken place at the date originally fixed in
13	the permit.

20	the use of suitable fireworks for agricultural purposes in
21	connection with the raising of crops and the protection of
22	crops from bird and animal damage.
23	(2) A permit granted under this subsection shall be
24	valid for the calendar year when the permit was issued.
25	(3) After a permit is granted under this subsection, the
26	sale, possession and use of fireworks of the type and for the
27	purpose mentioned in the permit shall be lawful for that
28	purpose only.
29	(b) Display permitsThe following apply:
30	(1) The governing body of a municipality may, in

6	<u>§ 1107. Applications for licenses to sell consumer fireworks.</u>
7	(a) ApplicationsAn application for a license to sell
8	consumer fireworks must be submitted to the department on forms
9	prescribed and provided by the department. The application shall
10	be accompanied by an annual license fee of \$5,000 per location.
11	(b) Inspection The following apply:
12	(1) A facility in existence on the effective date of
13	this section and a new facility shall be inspected by the
14	<u>department within 30 days of receipt of a complete</u>
15	application for a license. The department shall issue a
16	license or deny a license within 14 days of completing the
17	inspection.
18	(2) A license shall be effective for one year from the
19	date the license is issued, and renewal of a license shall be
20	automatic upon payment of the license fee.
21	(3) Each licensed facility shall be subject to an annual
22	inspection by the department and at other times in the
23	discretion of the department during normal business hours.
24	(c) ProhibitionNo license for the sale of consumer
25	fireworks shall be issued to a convicted felon or to an entity
26	where a convicted felon owns any percentage of the equity
27	interest in the entity.
28	§ 1108. Licensed facility operations.
29	(a) OperationsA facility licensed under section 1107
30	(relating to applications for licenses to sell consumer

1	fireworks) shall be exclusively dedicated to the storage and
2	sale of consumer fireworks and related items and the licensed
3	facility shall operate in accordance with the following:
4	(1) There shall be security personnel on the premises of
5	the licensed facility from June 28 through July 4 of each
6	year and from December 30 through January 2 of each year.
7	(2) No smoking shall be permitted in the licensed
8	facility.
9	(3) No cigarettes or tobacco products, matches, lighters
10	or any other flame-producing devices shall be permitted to be
11	taken into the licensed facility.
12	(4) No individual under 18 years of age shall be
13	permitted in the licensed facility unless accompanied by an
14	adult and an individual under 18 years of age shall stay with
15	an adult in the licensed facility.
16	(5) The licensed facility shall carry at least
17	\$2,000,000 in public and product liability insurance.
18	(6) No display fireworks shall be stored or located at a
19	licensed facility.
20	(7) No individual who appears to be under the influence
21	of intoxicating liquor or drugs shall be admitted to the
22	licensed facility and no liquor, beer or wine shall be
23	permitted in the licensed facility.
24	(8) No consumer fireworks or display fireworks shall be
25	ignited within 300 feet of the licensed facility.
26	(9) Emergency evacuation plans shall be conspicuously
27	posted in appropriate locations within the licensed facility.
28	(b) TrainingA licensee shall provide the licensee's
29	employees with documented training in the area of operational
30	safety of a facility. The licensee shall provide written

2	received training under this subsection.
3	<u>§ 1109. Registration with Attorney General.</u>
4	An entity which performs, provides or supervises fireworks
5	displays or exhibitions for profit shall register annually with
6	the Attorney General in accordance with 37 Pa. Code Ch. 711
7	(relating to registration for fireworks displays).
8	<u>§ 1110. Penalties.</u>
9	(a) Use of consumer fireworksA person who uses consumer
10	fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter
11	commits a summary offense and, upon conviction, shall be
12	sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$500 and the following
13	shall apply:
14	(1) A person using consumer or display fireworks in
15	violation of the provisions of this chapter for a second or
16	subsequent offense shall be sentenced to pay a fine of
17	<u>\$1,000.</u>
18	(2) In addition to the penalty under paragraph (1), each
19	firework in the possession of a person using fireworks in
20	violation of the provisions of this chapter for a second or
21	subsequent offense shall be confiscated and disposed of by
22	law enforcement.
23	(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
24	contrary, money collected from fines under this section shall
25	be retained by the municipality in which the violation
26	occurred and shall be used by law enforcement to increase
27	enforcement actions related to violations under this section.
28	(b) Sale of consumer fireworksA person who sells consumer
29	fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter commits
30	a misdemeanor of the second degree.

1	(c) Sale of display fireworksA person who sells display
2	fireworks in violation of the provisions of this chapter commits
3	a felony of the third degree.
4	(d) Sale of illegal explosivesA person commits a felony
5	of the third degree if the person sells any of the following:
6	(1) Illegal explosives as specified in 49 CFR 173.54
7	(relating to forbidden explosives).
8	(2) Illegal explosives in violation of any Federal law.
9	(3) Any explosive devices which have not been tested,
10	approved and labeled by the United States Department of
11	Transportation, including, but not limited to, those devices
12	<pre>commonly referred to as "M-80," "M-100," "blockbuster,"</pre>
13	"cherry bomb," "quarter stick" or "half stick."
14	<u>§ 1111. Removal of illegal fireworks.</u>
15	<u>The Pennsylvania State Police, an individual employed as a</u>
16	<u>municipal police officer as defined in 42 Pa.C.S. § 8951</u>
17	(relating to definitions) who holds a current certificate under
18	53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police
19	education and training), a sheriff or a deputy sheriff shall
20	take, remove or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner
21	all stocks of consumer fireworks or display fireworks or
22	combustibles used, offered or exposed for sale, stored or held
23	in violation of this chapter. The owner shall be responsible for
24	the storage and, if deemed necessary, the destruction of the
25	<u>illegal fireworks.</u>
26	Section 3. Repeals are as follows:
27	(1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
28	paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 3
29	Pa.C.S. Ch. 11.
