1 2 3	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in special vehicles and pedestrians, providing for electric low-speed scooter pilot program.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 3515. Electric low-speed scooter pilot program.</u>
9	(a) RequirementAn electric low-speed scooter may only be
10	<u>operated on a pedalcycle lane on a roadway, a roadway or a</u>
11	pedalcycle path within the boundaries of a city of the second
12	class where an executive order has been issued authorizing the
13	operation of electric low-speed scooters under a micro-mobility
14	pilot project as provided under subsection (b). Other places to
15	operate an electric low-speed scooter may be authorized by
16	executive order, in consultation with the property owner.
17	(b) Micro-mobility pilot projectAn executive order may be
18	issued in a city of the second class which authorizes the use of

1	electric low-speed scooters under a micro-mobility pilot project
2	to commence in the city of the second class and which provides a
3	limited fleet of electric low-speed scooters within the
4	boundaries of the city of a second class.
5	(c) OperationUnless otherwise specified, every individual
6	operating an electric low-speed scooter authorized under
7	subsection (a) shall be granted all of the rights and shall be
8	subject to all of the duties applicable to the operator of a
9	pedalcycle under this subchapter.
10	(d) Age requirementThe following shall apply:
11	(1) No individual under 16 years of age may operate an
12	electric low-speed scooter on a roadway unless permitted by
13	local ordinance.
14	(2) No commercial electric scooter enterprise may rent
15	an electric low-speed scooter to an individual under 16 years
16	<u>of age.</u>
17	<u>(e) Speed requirementNo individual may operate an</u>
18	electric low-speed scooter on a pedalcycle lane on a highway, a
19	roadway or a pedalcycle path at a speed greater than 15 miles
20	per hour.
21	(f) Lamps and reflectorsEvery electric low-speed scooter
22	when operated between sunset and sunrise shall be equipped on
23	the front with a lamp which emits a beam of white light intended
24	to illuminate the electric low-speed scooter's path and is
25	visible from a distance of at least 500 feet in front, a red
26	reflector facing to the rear which is visible at least 500 feet
27	to the rear and a reflector on each side.
28	(g) Operation prohibited on freewaysNo individual may
29	operate an electric low-speed scooter on a freeway.
30	(h) Powers of department and local authoritiesThis

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1 section shall not be deemed to prevent the department on State-
2 <u>designated highways and local authorities on streets or highways</u>
3 within the local authority's physical boundaries from the
4 reasonable exercise of the department's or the local authority's
5 <u>police powers.</u>
6 (i) Ordinances, policies and regulationsNotwithstanding
7 any other provision of law, a city of the second class may adopt
8 an ordinance, regulation or policy for the safety, operation and
9 management of electric low-speed scooters. If an electric low-
10 speed scooter operates on a roadway owned by the department, the
11 department shall be consulted prior to the adoption of the
12 ordinance, policy or regulation.
13 (j) PresumptionFor the purposes of this section, it is
14 presumed to be a reasonable exercise of police power to regulate
15 the use of electric low-speed scooters consistent with the
16 regulation of pedalcycles.
17 (k) ApplicationNotwithstanding Subchapter A of Chapter 11
18 <u>(relating to certificate of title) or Subchapter A of Chapter 13</u>
19 <u>(relating to general provisions), electric low-speed scooters</u>
20 authorized under this section shall not be required to comply
21 with certificate of title or vehicle registration requirements
22 <u>under this title.</u>
23 (1) ConstructionNotwithstanding any other provision of
24 law to the contrary, an electric low-speed scooter under this
25 article shall not be construed as a "motor vehicle" as defined
26 in section 102 (relating to definitions).
27 (m) ReportA city of the second class, in coordination
28 with the department, shall prepare a report on the micro-
29 mobility pilot program 60 days prior to the expiration of the
30 micro-mobility pilot program. The report shall:

1	(1) Include the number of rides, the number of
2	accidents, frequency of use, any ordinance, regulation or
3	policy adopted under subsection (i) and safety and economic
4	impacts.
5	(2) Be submitted to the chairperson and minority
6	chairperson of the Transportation Committee of the Senate and
7	the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
8	Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
9	(n) ExpirationThis section shall expire two years after
10	the effective date of this section.
11	(o) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
12	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
13	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Electric low-speed scooter." As follows:
15	(1) A device weighing less than 100 pounds that:
16	(i) has handlebars and an electric motor;
17	(ii) has a floorboard which can be stood upon while
18	riding; and
19	(iii) is solely powered by the electric motor or
20	human power, or both.
21	(2) The term does not include a pedalcycle with electric
22	assist, an electric personal assistive mobility device, a
23	motorcycle, a motorized pedalcycle or a motor-driven cycle.
24	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
