AN ACT

Amending Titles 51 (Military Affairs) and 62 (Procurement) of 1 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in veteran-owned 2 small businesses, further providing for definitions, for 3 regulations, for participation goal, for duties of Department of General Services, for bonding and progress payments, providing for request for full or partial waiver and good-4 5 6 faith efforts, further providing for reports and providing 7 8 for disparity study; in small and disadvantaged businesses, further providing for heading of chapter, for policy and for 9 definitions, providing for Small and Diverse Business Program 10 and for nonapplicability, further providing for regulations 11 and for duties of department, providing for request for full 12 or partial waiver and good-faith efforts, further providing 13 for bonding and progress payments and report to General 14 Assembly, providing for aspirational target, for disparity study and for program review and expiration; and providing 15 16 for Program for Construction and Design Professional 17 18 Services. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows: 21 Section 1. Section 9601 introductory paragraph of Title 51

18	veteran business enterprises in an agency procurement in order
19	<u>to meet a contract-specific goal.</u>

21	"Utilization schedule." A document, submitted by a bidder or
22	offeror as part of a bid or proposal, in which a bidder or
23	offeror commits to a level of veteran business enterprise
24	participation for a contract. If required by the solicitation, a
25	utilization schedule may also require a bidder or offeror to
26	identify:
27	(1) The veteran business enterprises that will be
28	utilized.
29	(2) Associated responsibilities and scopes of work.
30	(3) The dollar value or percentages of the work to be
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1 <u>performed.</u>

"Veteran business enterprise." A veteran-owned small 3 business or service-disabled veteran-owned small business. 4 * * * 5 Section 2. Sections 9602(a) and (c), 9603, 9604, 9605, 9606 6 7 and 9607 of Title 51 are amended to read: 8 § 9602. [Participation goal.] Statewide participation goal and 2 aspirational target. 3 A Statewide annual goal of not less than 3% participation by [veteran-owned small businesses, including service-disabled 4 veteran-owned small businesses,] veteran business enterprises is 5 established. [The participation goal shall apply to the total 6 value of all contracts available to small businesses in each 7 8 fiscal year.] The Secretary of General Services may set a 9 Statewide aspirational target for veteran business enterprise 10 participation which may be reviewed and adjusted every five years upon completion of a disparity study and which may not be 11 12 less than the Statewide annual goal. 13 § 9604. In reviewing a bidder's or offeror's 21 written request for a partial or full waiver of a contract 22 23 specific goal, the purchasing agency, based on the 24 recommendation of the Department of General Services, shall 25 determine if a bidder or offeror has made good-faith efforts to 26 meet the contract-specific goal and to what extent the waiver 27 request should be granted. In determining if a bidder or offeror has made good-faith efforts, the purchasing agency and the 28 29 Department of General Services may consider levels of participation by veteran business enterprises by other bidders 30

2 § 9607. Reports.

3 [(a) Report to Department of General Services. -- By August 15, 2013, and each August 15 thereafter, each executive agency 4 5 and independent agency shall submit an annual report for the period of July 1 to June 30 to the Department of General 6 Services on actual utilization of veteran-owned small businesses 7 and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses as 8 9 contractors, subcontractors, suppliers and professional service 10 providers. (b) Report to standing committees.--11 12 The Department of General Services and each State-(1) 13 affiliated entity shall annually, before October 1, report in 14 writing to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and 15 16 Emergency Preparedness Committee of the House of 17 Representatives the actual utilization, Statewide and by each 18 purchasing agency, of veteran-owned small businesses and 19 service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses during the 20 preceding fiscal year. 21 (2) The report shall include a list of all veteran-owned 22 small businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses that participated as contractors, subcontractors, 23 24 suppliers and professional service providers during the 25 preceding fiscal year. 26 (3) Initial reports under this subsection shall be 27 submitted to the standing committees by October 1, 2013.] 28 The Department of General Services shall annually report in 29 writing to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and Emergency 30 20210SB0900PN1116 - 8 -

3 § 2102. Definitions.

Subject to section 2103 (relating to policy and regulations), 4 the following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall 5 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 6 7 context clearly indicates otherwise: ["Disadvantaged business." A small business which is owned 8 or controlled by a majority of persons, not limited to members 9 of minority groups, who have been deprived of the opportunity to 10 develop and maintain a competitive position in the economy 11 12 because of social disadvantages.] 13 "Agency liaison." An agency employee reporting directly to a 14 secretary, agency head or equivalent responsible for assisting the agency on issues related to the program. 15 "Aspirational target." A target established by the Secretary 16 of General Services under section 2109 (relating to aspirational 17 18 target). 19 "Contract-specific goal." A goal established by the department in collaboration with the purchasing agency for use 20 21 of small diverse businesses on a specific procurement. 22 "Disparity study." A study conducted to determine whether there is a disparity between the availability and use of small_ 23 24 diverse businesses in Commonwealth procurement. 25 "Good-faith efforts." The practices or activities instituted 26 by a bidder or offeror to promote and ensure participation by 27 small diverse businesses in an agency procurement in order to 28 meet a contract-specific goal. 29 "Program." The Small Diverse Business Program established under section 2102.1 (relating to Small Diverse Business 30

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1 Program).

2	"Small business." A business in the United States which is
3	independently owned[,] <u>and</u> is not dominant in its field of
4	operation [and employs 100 or fewer employees].
5	"Small diverse business." A small business owned or
6	controlled by a majority of persons, not limited to members of
7	minority groups, that have been deprived of the opportunity to
8	develop and maintain a competitive position in the economy
9	because of economic and social disadvantages.
10	"Race- and gender-neutral measures." Methodologies that are
11	or can be used to assist businesses, notwithstanding the social,
12	economic, racial or gender composition of the individuals that
13	own or control the business.
14	"Utilization schedule." A document, submitted by a bidder or
15	offeror as part of a bid or proposal, in which a bidder or
16	offeror commits to a level of small diverse business
17	participation for a contract. If required by the solicitation, a
18	utilization schedule may also require a bidder or offeror to
19	identify:
20	(1) The small diverse businesses that will be utilized.
21	(2) Associated responsibilities and scopes of work.
22	(3) The dollar value or percentages of the work to be
23	performed.

30	suggestions concerning the program, with the assistance of
