## AN ACT

6	which an individual, a highly automated vehicle driver or ADS

9	trip cannot or should not be continued.
10	"Operational design domain" or "ODD." Operating conditions
11	under which a given ADS is specifically designed to function,
12	including, but not limited to, environmental, geographical and
13	time-of-day restrictions and the requisite presence or absence
14	of certain traffic or highway characteristics.
15	"Request to intervene." Notification by an ADS to a highly
16	automated vehicle driver that the highly automated vehicle
17	driver should promptly begin or resume performance of part or
18	all of the DDT or achieve a minimal risk condition.
