- 13 <u>(iv) Assist in coordinating school programs relevant to a</u>
- 14 <u>military connected student.</u>
- 15 (3) Maintain an easily accessible web page on the public
- 16 <u>school's publicly accessible Internet website to provide</u>
- 17 resources for a military connected student and the military-
- 18 connected student's parent or quardian, including information
- 19 regarding:
- 20 (i) Relocation to the public school, enrollment at the
- 21 public school, registration at the public school and
- 22 transferring records to the public school.
- 23 (ii) Academic planning, course sequences and advanced
- 24 classes available at the public school.
- 25 (iii) Counseling and other support services available for a
- 26 <u>military-connected student.</u>
- 27 <u>(4) Maintain a transition initiative led by students, when</u>
- 28 appropriate, that assists a military connected student in

6	FOLLOWING:
7	(1) SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT CERTIFYING
8	THAT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MEETS THE PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS
9	UNDER THIS SECTION.
10	(2) DESIGNATE A STAFF MEMBER AS A MILITARY LIAISON. THE
11	MILITARY LIAISON SHALL HAVE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING DUTIES:
