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AN ACT

1 To provide appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses  
2 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the  
4 fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, and for the  
5 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close  
6 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022; to provide  
7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the  
8 Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July  
9 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, and for the payment of bills  
10 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
11 30, 2022; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds  
12 to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year  
13 July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, and for the payment of bills  
14 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
15 30, 2022.

8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 PART I

10 GENERAL PROVISIONS

11 Section 101. Short title.

12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General  
13 Appropriation Act of 2022.

14 Section 102. Definitions.

15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall  
16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  
17 context clearly indicates otherwise:

18 "COVID" or "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an  
19 infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome  
20 coronavirus 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in  
21 Wuhan, China.

22 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,  
23 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

24 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
25 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
26 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
27 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
28 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
29 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
30 other assistants in a department, board or commission.



1 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
2 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
3 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
4 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,  
5 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll  
6 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising  
7 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,  
8 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of  
9 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and  
10 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums  
11 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on  
12 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer  
13 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee  
14 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,  
15 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and  
16 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the  
17 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery  
18 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment  
19 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other  
20 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for  
21 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of  
22 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term  
23 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the  
24 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must  
25 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case  
26 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that  
27 provided under the State medical assistance program.

28 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the  
29 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

26 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part LI, the sums  
27 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
28 are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies  
29 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
30 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
2 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
3 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
4 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
5 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
6 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
7 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
8 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified  
9 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of  
10 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior  
11 fiscal year.

12 (b) Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part  
13 LI, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be  
14 necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special funds  
15 and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the Executive  
16 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of  
17 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the  
18 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for  
19 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
20 purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any  
21 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for  
22 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and  
23 for the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal  
24 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
25 at the close of the prior fiscal year.

26 Section 105. Federal appropriations.

27 Except as otherwise provided in Part LI, the Federal  
28 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
29 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of  
30 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth specified in this

1 act for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying  
2 out the programs specified in this act for the current fiscal  
3 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
4 at the close of the prior fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated,  
5 the Federal appropriations include any carryovers from the prior  
6 fiscal year.

20 Section 6101. General Fund repository for Federal funds.

21 Moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions  
22 or supplements to the departments or agencies of the  
23 Commonwealth or the programs provided in this act shall be paid  
24 into the General Fund.

25 Section 6102. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal  
26 funds.

27 Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent  
28 that the money is estimated as being available during the fiscal  
29 year of the Commonwealth.

30 Section 6103. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal funds.

1 (a) General rule.--Federal moneys that have been previously  
2 appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated  
3 by the Federal Government but remain unspent from the prior  
4 fiscal year or previous fiscal years and will not be renewed for  
5 the current fiscal year are appropriated.

6 (b) Department of Human Services.--The Federal

8 prior earnings that may be received during the current fiscal  
9 year. In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated in

15 (d) Federal funding related to COVID-19 and the impact of

6 Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement

10 act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the  
11 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

12 Section 7105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous

14 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:

1 Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.

2 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds  
3 of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in  
4 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the  
5 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of  
6 debt service due on outstanding bonds. If the excess money,  
7 together with any available balance, exceeds the amount of debt  
8 service remaining to be paid, the money shall be transferred to  
9 the General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible  
10 for the debt service.

11 Section 7109. Transfers for government support agencies.

12 During the current fiscal year, any prior year amount

5 Section 7110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment

10 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the
