AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An 1 act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public 2 welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in preliminary provisions, 3 further providing for definitions; in general powers and duties of the Department of Human Services, providing for 5 employment opportunities, for pilot programs, for system innovation, for simplify the system reports, for 6 7 strengthening in-home and community supports and companion 8 services, for intellectual disability and autism 9 transportation reform, for weighted licensure, for private 10 accreditation and licensure, for reinvestment, for assessment accuracy and timeliness, for reports and for Information 11 12 Sharing and Advisory Committee; and making editorial changes. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 15 hereby enacts as follows: 16 Section 1. Section 102 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, 17 No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended to read: 18 Section 102. Definitions .-- Subject to additional definitions 19 contained in subsequent articles of this act, the following 20 words when used in this act shall have, unless the context 21 clearly indicates otherwise, the meanings given them in this 22 section:
- 23 "Department" means the Department of Human Services of this

- 2 "ISAC" means the Information Sharing and Advisory Committee
- 3 established under section 228.
- 4 <u>"ODP" means the Office of Developmental Programs of the</u>
- 5 Department of Human Services.
- 6 "OVR" means the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation of the
- 7 Department of Labor and Industry.
- 8 "Secretary" means the Secretary of Human Services of this
- 9 Commonwealth.
- 10 Section 2. Article II heading of the act is amended to read:
- 11 ARTICLE II
- 12 GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES
- OF THE DEPARTMENT OF [PUBLIC WELFARE] HUMAN SERVICES
- 14 Section 3. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 15 Section 217. Employment Opportunities. -- Relying on reports
- 16 and data received by the Employment First Oversight Commission,
- 17 the ODP shall prepare and submit an annual report to the General
- 18 Assembly on the employment rate for people with disabilities in
- 19 competitive, integrated employment, barriers to employment and
- 20 <u>strategies for overcoming the barriers for individuals employed</u>
- 21 on or before October 1. The report shall include the following:
- 22 (1) The distribution of number of hours of employment per
- 23 week.
- 24 (2) Hourly wage.
- 25 (3) Impact on individuals with intellectual disabilities and
- 26 autism such as physical health outcomes, behavioral outcomes and
- 27 <u>increased independence.</u>
- 28 <u>(4) Length of current employment.</u>
- 29 Section 218. Pilot Programs. -- (a) The OVR and ODP shall
- 30 jointly oversee and implement a two-year pilot program to better

- 1 coordinate eligibility, supports, funding and oversight of
- 2 employment services for the benefit of individuals with
- 3 intellectual disability, developmental disability or autism
- 4 <u>spectrum disorder.</u>
- 5 (b) The department, in consultation with the Department of
- 6 Labor and Industry and the Employment First Oversight
- 7 Commission, shall prepare and submit to the General Assembly and
- 8 <u>release to the public an annual report on or before October 1</u>
- 9 that includes the following information:
- 10 (1) Employment rate of pilot participants and distribution
- 11 among standard occupational classifications.
- 12 (2) The distribution of number of hours of employment per
- 13 <u>week.</u>
- 14 (3) Hourly wage.
- 15 (4) Impact on individuals with intellectual disabilities and
- 16 <u>autism</u>, <u>including physical health outcomes</u>, <u>behavioral outcomes</u>
- 17 and increased independence.
- 18 <u>(5) Length of current employment.</u>
- 19 Section 219. System Innovation. -- The ODP may obtain
- 20 necessary approvals from the Federal Government to implement and
- 21 conduct pilot programs under the medical assistance program with
- 22 the agreement of stakeholders, including the Pennsylvania
- 23 Advocacy and Resources for Autism and Intellectual Disability,
- 24 the Rehabilitation and Community Providers Association, the Arc
- 25 of Pennsylvania, Vision for Equality and Disability Rights
- 26 Pennsylvania, the Provider Alliance, the Alliance of Community
- 27 <u>Service Providers and Max Association.</u>
- 28 Section 220. Simplify the System Reports. -- (a) Through the
- 29 ISAC, the ODP shall convene a group of stakeholders to simplify
- 30 the intellectual disability/autism system for individuals,

- 1 families, providers and the State, shall eliminate redundancies
- 2 and shall ensure a foundation of self-determined outcomes. The
- 3 report shall address at a minimum the following areas:
- 4 (1) Administrative, including:
- 5 <u>(i) Service planning.</u>
- 6 <u>(ii) Billing.</u>
- 7 <u>(iii) Incident management.</u>
- 8 (iv) Audits.
- 9 <u>(2) Autism.</u>
- 10 (3) Children.
- 11 (4) Healthcare, including:
- 12 <u>(i) Behavioral health.</u>
- 13 <u>(ii) Dental health.</u>
- 14 <u>(iii) Nursing and health services.</u>
- 15 <u>(5) Employment.</u>
- 16 <u>(6) Housing.</u>
- 17 (7) Individuals with medically complex needs.
- 18 (8) Involvement with the criminal justice system.
- 19 (9) Other related areas where administrative redundancies
- 20 can be eliminated and operational efficiencies can be realized.
- 21 (b) The Deputy Secretary of ODP shall present the report to
- 22 the Governor, the secretary and system stakeholders no later
- 23 than November 1, 2022. After the submission of the report, any
- 24 assigned committee will be deemed to have fulfilled its duties
- 25 under this section.
- 26 Section 221. Strengthening In-Home and Community Supports
- 27 and Companion Services. -- (a) Through the ISAC, the ODP shall
- 28 complete a study on the long-term benefits of in-home and
- 29 community supports and companion services delivered to
- 30 individuals enrolled in the ODP administered home and community-

- 1 based services waivers. The study shall include satisfaction of
- 2 <u>service recipients</u>, <u>financial impact</u>, <u>barriers to access and</u>
- 3 provider capacity. The ODP shall submit the study to the
- 4 Governor and General Assembly by November 1, 2022. After the
- 5 submission of the report, any assigned committee will be deemed
- 6 to have fulfilled its duties under this section.
- 7 Section 222. Intellectual Disability and Autism
- 8 Transportation Reform. -- The ODP, in consultation with the ISAC
- 9 and any other necessary committee, shall develop and propose
- 10 recommendations to the Department of Transportation regarding
- 11 improvements in access to public transportation by individuals
- 12 with intellectual disability or autism. The Department of
- 13 <u>Transportation shall review the recommendations in coordination</u>
- 14 with the Governor for consideration for submission to the
- 15 General Assembly for legislative action by November 1, 2022.
- 16 After the submission of the report, any assigned committee will
- 17 be deemed to have fulfilled its duties under this section.
- 18 Section 223. Weighted Licensure. -- Facilities licensed under
- 19 55 Pa. Code Chapters 2380, 2390, 6400 and 6500 shall be given
- 20 the option to have differential or weighted licensure status
- 21 based on the assessment of a licensee's level of compliance with
- 22 applicable regulations. The department shall propose regulations
- 23 for differential and weighted licensure measurement. The
- 24 regulations shall focus licensure review of regulatory
- 25 <u>compliance on licensees in the lower 15th percentile of licensed</u>
- 26 providers as determined by the number of citations and the
- 27 <u>number of recipients in the licensed service.</u>
- 28 Section 224. Private Accreditation and Licensure. --
- 29 Facilities licensed under 55 Pa. Code Chapters 2380, 2390, 6400
- 30 and 6500 shall qualify for compliance with licensure standards

- 1 from the department if the facilities are accredited by a
- 2 private nongovernmental organization such as the Commission on
- 3 Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, provided that the
- 4 <u>accreditation standards meet or exceed applicable department</u>
- 5 <u>licensing standards. The department shall conduct reviews on</u>
- 6 department licensing standards for which the accreditation
- 7 <u>standards do not meet or exceed applicable department licensing</u>
- 8 <u>standards. Facilities shall be responsible for the cost of</u>
- 9 <u>obtaining accreditation.</u>
- 10 Section 225. Reinvestment. -- Savings in State funds achieved
- 11 by the adoption of the policies and procedures described in
- 12 <u>sections 218 through 224 shall be dedicated to increasing wages</u>
- 13 for direct support professionals who render care and support
- 14 under ODP administered waiver programs that fund community-based
- 15 services to individuals with an intellectual disability or
- 16 autism and to fund services for individuals on the waiting list
- 17 for ODP administered waiver services.
- 18 <u>Section 226. Assessment Accuracy and Timeliness.--The</u>
- 19 <u>department shall assure that for all ODP services with funding</u>
- 20 based on an assessment process, that the assessment shall be
- 21 completed within thirty of days of request and that a change to
- 22 rates triggered by reassessment is effective beginning on the
- 23 date of request.
- 24 Section 227. Reports. -- The reports produced by this act will
- 25 be used to inform the ODP on decisions of improvements,
- 26 innovations and solutions to improve outcomes in the service
- 27 <u>delivery system.</u>
- 28 Section 228. Information Sharing and Advisory Committee. --
- 29 (a) The department shall establish the Information Sharing and
- 30 Advisory Committee.

- 1 (b) The committee shall consist of a representative from
- 2 each of the following organizations:
- 3 (1) Pennsylvania Advocacy and Resources for Autism and
- 4 <u>Intellectual Disability.</u>
- 5 (2) Rehabilitation & Community Providers Association.
- 6 (3) The ARC of Pennsylvania.
- 7 <u>(4) Disability Rights Pennsylvania.</u>
- 8 <u>(5) The Provider Alliance.</u>
- 9 <u>(6) MAX Association.</u>
- 10 (7) The Alliance of Community Service Providers.
- 11 <u>(8) Vision for Equality.</u>
- 12 (9) Self Advocates United as 1.
- 13 (10) Institute on Disabilities at Temple University.
- 14 (c) The department shall establish the committee within
- 15 three months of the effective date of this section, appoint a
- 16 Chair and Vice Chair and facilitate quarterly meetings of the
- 17 committee. The department shall also share with the committee
- 18 any report prepared in accordance with this act at least ten
- 19 days before submitting the report to the General Assembly.
- 20 Section 4. Article III heading of the act is amended to
- 21 read:
- 22 ARTICLE III
- 23 STATE INSTITUTIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 24 [PUBLIC WELFARE] <u>HUMAN RESOURCES</u>
- 25 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
