AN ACT

Amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), entitled <--"An act requiring the licensing of practitioners of 2 3 osteopathic medicine and surgery; regulating their practice; providing for certain funds and penalties for violations and repeals," further providing for definitions and for athletictrainers; and abrogating a regulation. AMENDING THE ACT OF DECEMBER 20, 1985 (P.L.457, NO.112), ENTITLED "AN ACT RELATING TO THE RIGHT TO PRACTICE MEDICINE 8 AND SURGERY AND THE RIGHT TO PRACTICE MEDICALLY RELATED ACTS; REESTABLISHING THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL EDUCATION AND 10 LICENSURE AS THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICINE AND PROVIDING FOR 11 ITS COMPOSITION, POWERS AND DUTIES; PROVIDING FOR THE 12 13 ISSUANCE OF LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES AND THE SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES; PROVIDED PENALTIES; AND MAKING REPEALS, " FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; AND 15 ABROGATING AN INCONSISTENT REGULATION. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. The definitions of "athletic training services," <--20 "direction" and "physically active person" in section 2 of the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, are amended to read: Section 2. Definitions. 23 24 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

- 1 have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 2 meanings given to them in this section:
- 3 * * *
- 4 "Athletic training services." The management and provision
- 5 of care of injuries to [a physically active person] an_
- 6 <u>individual</u> as defined in this act with the direction of a
- 7 licensed physician. The term includes the rendering of emergency
- 8 care, development of injury prevention programs and providing
- 9 appropriate preventative and supporting devices for the
- 10 [physically active person] individual. The term also includes
- 11 the assessment, management, treatment, rehabilitation and
- 12 reconditioning of the [physically active person] individual
- 13 whose conditions are within the professional preparation and
- 14 education of a licensed athletic trainer. The term also includes
- 15 the use of modalities such as mechanical stimulation, heat,
- 16 cold, light, air, water, electricity, sound, massage and the use-
- 17 of therapeutic exercises, reconditioning exercise and fitness
- 18 programs. Athletic training services shall not include surgery[,
- 19 invasive procedures] or prescription of any controlled
- 20 substance.

- 22 "Direction." Supervision over the actions of a licensed
- 23 athletic trainer via referral by prescription to treat
- 24 conditions for [a physically active person] an individual from a
- 25 licensed physician, dentist or podiatrist or written protocol
- 26 approved by a supervising physician, dentist or podiatrist,
- 27 except that the physical presence of the supervising physician,
- 28 dentist or podiatrist is not required if the supervising
- 29 physician, dentist or podiatrist is readily available for
- 30 consultation by direct communication, radio, telephone,

- 1 facsimile, telecommunications or via other electronic means.

- 3 ["Physically active person." An individual who participates
- 4 in organized, individual or team sports, athletic games or
- 5 recreational sport activity.]

- 7 Section 2. Section 7.1(a) of the act is amended to read:
- 8 Section 7.1. Athletic trainers.
- 9 (a) An athletic trainer licensed by the board may, under the
- 10 direction of a physician, podiatrist or dentist, provide-
- 11 athletic training services to [a physically active person] an
- 12 <u>individual</u> under the care of a physician, dentist or podiatrist.
- 13 An athletic trainer licensed under this section shall refer [a-
- 14 physically active person] an individual with conditions outside
- 15 the scope of athletic training services to a physician, dentist-
- 16 or podiatrist.

- 18 Section 3. The provisions of 49 Pa. Code Ch. 25 Subch. M are
- 19 abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with the amendment of
- 20 sections 2 and 7.1(a) of the act.
- 21 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
- 22 SECTION 1. THE DEFINITIONS OF "ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES" <--
- 23 AND "PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON" IN SECTION 2 OF THE ACT OF
- 24 DECEMBER 20, 1985 (P.L.457, NO.112), KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL
- 25 PRACTICE ACT OF 1985, ARE AMENDED TO READ:
- 26 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 27 THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS ACT SHALL
- 28 HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE
- 29 CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:

1	"ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES."
2	(1) THE MANAGEMENT AND PROVISION OF CARE OF INJURIES TO
3	A PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON AS DEFINED IN THIS ACT WITH THE
4	DIRECTION OF A LICENSED PHYSICIAN. THE TERM INCLUDES THE
5	RENDERING OF EMERGENCY CARE, DEVELOPMENT OF INJURY PREVENTION
6	PROGRAMS AND PROVIDING APPROPRIATE PREVENTATIVE AND
7	SUPPORTING DEVICES FOR THE PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON. THE TERM
8	ALSO INCLUDES THE ASSESSMENT, MANAGEMENT, TREATMENT,
9	REHABILITATION AND RECONDITIONING OF THE PHYSICALLY ACTIVE
10	PERSON WHOSE CONDITIONS ARE WITHIN THE PROFESSIONAL
11	PREPARATION AND EDUCATION OF A LICENSED ATHLETIC TRAINER. THE
12	TERM ALSO INCLUDES THE USE OF MODALITIES SUCH AS MECHANICAL
13	STIMULATION, HEAT, COLD, LIGHT, AIR, WATER, ELECTRICITY,
14	SOUND, MASSAGE AND THE USE OF THERAPEUTIC EXERCISES,
15	RECONDITIONING EXERCISE AND FITNESS PROGRAMS.
16	(2) ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES SHALL NOT INCLUDE
17	[SURGERY, INVASIVE PROCEDURES OR PRESCRIPTION OF ANY
18	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE] ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
19	(I) SURGERY.
20	(II) PRESCRIPTION OF ANY CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.
21	(III) INVASIVE PROCEDURES, EXCEPT AN ATHLETIC
22	TRAINER LICENSED TO PRACTICE MAY, WITH THE DIRECTION OF A
23	LICENSED PHYSICIAN, PERFORM THE FOLLOWING INVASIVE
24	PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO A WRITTEN PROTOCOL:
25	(A) RECTAL THERMOMETRY.
26	(B) INTRAMUSCULAR OR SUBCUTANEOUS MEDICATION
27	ADMINISTRATION INJECTIONS.
28	(C) AIRWAY ADJUNCTS IN CONFORMITY WITH BASIC
29	LIFE SUPPORT PROTOCOLS AND INSTRUMENTS.
30	(D) CAPILLARY FINGER STICKS FOR THE PURPOSE OF

1 TESTING BLOOD GLUCOSE LEVELS. 2 (E) NASAL PLUGS. 3 (F) BLISTER AND NAIL CARE. (G) ADMINISTRATION OF NALOXONE. 4 (H) REMOVAL OF SUPERFICIAL FOREIGN BODIES. 5 6 (I) ANY OTHER PROCEDURES AUTHORIZED BY THE 7 BOARD. 8 (3) NOTHING IN THIS DEFINITION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO 9 REOUIRE A LICENSED PHYSICIAN TO AUTHORIZE A LICENSED ATHLETIC TRAINER TO PERFORM INVASIVE PROCEDURES. 10 11 "PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON." AN INDIVIDUAL WHO [PARTICIPATES 12 13 IN ORGANIZED, INDIVIDUAL OR TEAM SPORTS, ATHLETIC GAMES OR 14 RECREATIONAL SPORT ACTIVITY.] ENGAGES IN AN ACTIVITY THAT MAY BE ASSOCIATED WITH ANY INJURY, DISORDER OR MEDICAL CONDITION WHICH 15 16 REQUIRES A LEVEL OF STRENGTH, ENDURANCE, FLEXIBILITY, RANGE OF MOTION, SPEED OR AGILITY OR COULD RESULT FROM EXERCISE, SPORTS, 17 18 RECREATION, WELLNESS OR EMPLOYMENT. 19 * * * SECTION 2. THE PROVISIONS OF 49 PA. CODE CH. 18 SUBCH. E ARE 20 ABROGATED INSOFAR AS THEY ARE INCONSISTENT WITH THE AMENDMENT OF 21 THE DEFINITIONS OF "ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES" AND "PHYSICALLY 22 ACTIVE PERSON" IN SECTION 2 OF THE ACT. 23 24 SECTION 3. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
