Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in domestic and sexual violence victim 2 address confidentiality, further providing for definitions, 3 for persons eligible to apply and for application and 4 certification process. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 6702 of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read: § 6702. Definitions. 10 11 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 12 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 13 * * * 14 15 "Victim of child abduction." A victim of an offense that is: 16 (1) enumerated in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2904 (relating to 17 interference with custody of children); and 18 (2) graded as a felony. * * * 19

- 3 in individuals) or 3012 (relating to involuntary servitude).

- 5 Section 2. Section 6704 of Title 23 is amended by adding
- 6 paragraphs to read:
- 7 § 6704. Persons eligible to apply.
- 8 The following persons shall be eligible to apply to become
- 9 program participants:

- 11 (6) A victim of child abduction who files an affidavit
- 12 <u>with the Office of Victim Advocate describing the</u>
- 13 <u>perpetrator's course of conduct or repeated actions toward</u>
- the affiant meeting the criteria enumerated in 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 15 <u>2904 (relating to interference with custody of children) that</u>
- is graded as a felony and further stating that the affiant
- 17 fears future violent acts by the perpetrator of the child
- 18 abduction.
- 19 (7) A victim of human trafficking who files an affidavit
- 20 <u>with the Office of Victim Advocate describing the</u>
- 21 perpetrator's course of conduct or repeated actions toward
- 22 <u>the affiant meeting the criteria enumerated in either 18</u>
- 23 Pa.C.S. § 3011 (relating to trafficking in individuals) or
- 24 <u>3012 (relating to involuntary servitude) and further stating</u>
- 25 that the affiant fears future violent acts by the perpetrator
- of the human trafficking.
- 27 Section 3. Section 6705(a) of Title 23 is amended to read:
- 28 § 6705. Application and certification process.
- 29 (a) General rule.--A person must file an application with
- 30 the Office of Victim Advocate on a form prescribed by the Office

- 1 of Victim Advocate. An application and any supporting
- 2 documentation may be filed electronically, by mail or in person.
- 3 The Office of Victim Advocate shall certify eligible applicants
- 4 as program participants in accordance with the procedures
- 5 outlined in subsection (b). Certification shall be valid for a
- 6 period of three years following the date of certification unless
- 7 the certification is withdrawn or canceled before the expiration
- 8 of that period.

- 10 Section 4. The Office of Victim Advocate may promulgate
- 11 regulations to effectuate the following:
- 12 (1) The addition of the definitions of "victim of child
- abduction" and "victim of human trafficking" in 23 Pa.C.S. §
- 14 6702.
- 15 (2) The amendment or addition of 23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6704(6)
- 16 and (7) and 6705(a).
- 17 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
