AN ACT

1 Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An
2 act to promote the public health and safety by providing for
3 examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who
4 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining
5 cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools,
6 students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and
7 cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the
8 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the
9 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts
10 by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties,"
11 providing for cosmetology training through career and
12 technical center.

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. The act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred
16 to as the Cosmetology Law, is amended by adding a section to
17 read:

18 Section 6.1. Cosmetology training through career and
19 technical center.--(a) A CTE cosmetology student may earn up to
20 three hundred fifty hours of education through participation in
21 out-of-school programs, subject to the following:

22 (1) The CTE cosmetology student must be supervised by a

1 licensed cosmetologist or cosmetology teacher who has at least
2 five years of experience.

3 (2) The program educator may use information obtained from
4 the out-of-school program in gauging and grading the CTE
5 cosmetology student's skill level.

6 (3) The out-of-school program shall notify each client upon
7 whom the CTE cosmetology student performs a service that the
8 service is being performed by a CTE cosmetology student.

9 (4) A CTE cosmetology student may receive compensation for
10 services rendered in the out-of-school program.

11 (b) A CTE cosmetology student may not earn less than two
12 hundred fifty hours through in-person instruction at the CTC.

13 (c) This section shall apply only to a CTE cosmetology
14 student and shall not apply to a student enrolled and
15 participating in an adult and continuing education program
16 offered by a CTC.

17 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
18 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:

19 "CTC" means a Department of Education area career and
20 technical school as defined in section 1841 of the act of March
21 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of
22 1949.

23 "CTE cosmetology student" means a career and technical
24 education student receiving a secondary education from a CTC in
25 a cosmetology program of study.

26 "Out-of-school program" means a program conducted off CTC
27 grounds, including cooperative education, job shadowing,
28 internships, community exploration, registered apprenticeships
29 and community service learning designed to provide students with
30 real world experiences under the general supervision of a

1 program educator.

2 "Program educator" means a CTC educator holding a career and
3 technical certification issued by the Department of Education
4 and a cosmetology teacher licensed under this act.

5 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
