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AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for parental notification relating to instructional materials and books containing sexually explicit content. 5 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 12 section to read: 13 Section 1529. Parental Notification Relating to 14 Instructional Materials and Books Containing Sexually Explicit Content. -- (a) The governing body of a school entity shall 15 16 develop and make public policies that provide parental 17 notification of instructional materials and books containing

procedures and standards relating to:

sexually explicit content and include information, quidance,

- 1 containing sexually explicit subjects that are used by or made
- 2 <u>available to students at schools in the school entity.</u>
- 3 (2) Directly identifying books within libraries of the
- 4 schools containing sexually explicit content that are used by or
- 5 made available to students at schools in the school entity.
- 6 (3) Ensuring parental notification of specific sexually
- 7 <u>explicit content prior to student exposure.</u>
- 8 (4) Permitting the parent or legal guardian of a student to:
- 9 (i) Review instructional materials that contain sexually
- 10 explicit content and require the school entity to provide, as an
- 11 <u>alternative</u>, nonexplicit instructional materials and related
- 12 <u>academic activities to the student, if requested by the parent</u>
- 13 <u>or legal guardian.</u>
- 14 (ii) Review a book from the school library containing
- 15 <u>sexually explicit content that the student wishes to view and</u>
- 16 prevent the student from viewing the book if requested by the
- 17 parent or legal guardian.
- (b) Prior to adopting the policies required under this
- 19 section, the governing body of a school entity shall seek input
- 20 at a public forum to ensure that the policies are consistent
- 21 with this section and adopted no later than August 30, 2022.
- 22 (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 23 (1) Prohibit a school entity from implementing additional
- 24 <u>transparency measures for sexually explicit content.</u>
- 25 (2) Prevent a school entity from determining that sexually
- 26 explicit content is not appropriate for minors or certain ages
- 27 of students within the school entity, even when the content
- 28 would not violate other laws.
- 29 (3) Permit the giving of sexually explicit materials to
- 30 minors that are prohibited by any other applicable law.

- 1 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 2 <u>shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless</u>
- 3 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 <u>"School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, joint</u>
- 5 school, area career and technical school, charter school,
- 6 regional charter school or cyber charter school.
- 7 "Sexual conduct." As defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5903(e)(3)
- 8 <u>(relating to obscene and other sexual materials and</u>
- 9 <u>performances</u>).
- "Sexually explicit content." Shall include the following:
- 11 (1) Materials that contain visual or visually implied
- 12 depictions of sexual conduct or simulations of sexual conduct.
- 13 (2) Materials that contain explicit written descriptions of
- 14 <u>sexual conduct.</u>
- 15 (3) Materials that contain visual depictions of nudity
- 16 <u>accessible to minors in kindergarten through grade eight.</u>
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
