AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, 5 providing for Internet safety education curriculum. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10 11 section to read: 12 Section 1555. Internet Safety Education Curriculum. -- (a) 13 The department, in consultation with the Office of Attorney 14 General, shall establish an age-appropriate curriculum for 15 Internet safety instruction of students in kindergarten through
- 16 grade twelve. Beginning with the school year that commences
- 17 <u>after the effective date of this section</u>, a school district
- 18 shall incorporate into the school curriculum a component on
- 19 Internet safety to be taught at least once each school year to
- 20 students in kindergarten through grade twelve. The school board

- 1 <u>shall determine the scope and duration of this unit of</u>
- 2 instruction. The age-appropriate unit of instruction may be
- 3 incorporated into the current courses of study regularly taught
- 4 <u>in the district's schools, as determined by the school board.</u>
- 5 Such instruction shall be chosen from a menu of options
- 6 developed by the department, which shall include, but not be
- 7 <u>limited to, the following topics:</u>
- 8 (1) Safe and responsible use of social networking websites,
- 9 chat rooms, e-mail, bulletin boards, instant messaging and other
- 10 means of communication on the Internet.
- 11 (2) Recognizing, avoiding and reporting online solicitations
- 12 of students, their classmates and their friends by sexual
- 13 <u>predators</u>.
- 14 (3) Risks of transmitting personal information on the
- 15 Internet.
- 16 (4) Recognizing and avoiding unsolicited or deceptive
- 17 communications received online.
- 18 (5) Recognizing and reporting online harassment and cyber
- 19 bullying.
- 20 (6) Reporting illegal activities and communications on the
- 21 Internet.
- 22 (7) Copyright laws on written materials, photographs, music
- 23 and video.
- (b) The department may develop curricula to serve the
- 25 instructional needs of multiple grades of students, such as one
- 26 curriculum for elementary school students, one curriculum for
- 27 <u>middle school students and one curriculum for high school</u>
- 28 students.
- 29 (c) In developing the Internet safety education curriculum,
- 30 the department shall take into consideration similar curricula

- 1 in other states and other curricular materials suggested by
- 2 education experts, child psychologists or technology companies
- 3 that work on child online safety issues. The department shall
- 4 <u>also conduct a thorough review of publicly available materials</u>
- 5 on the topics of safe online communications, privacy protection,
- 6 cyber bullying, viewing inappropriate material, file-sharing and
- 7 the importance of open communications with responsible adults.
- 8 The department and the State Board of Education shall make such
- 9 resource materials that they deem appropriate available on their
- 10 publicly accessible Internet websites.
- 11 (d) Curricula devised in accordance with subsection (a)
- 12 <u>shall be developed within six (6) months of the effective date</u>
- 13 of this section.
- 14 (e) A parent or legal guardian of a student who is under
- 15 eighteen (18) years of age, within a reasonable period of time
- 16 after the request is made, shall be permitted to examine the
- 17 Internet safety curriculum instructional materials at the school
- 18 in which the student is enrolled.
- 19 (f) At the request of a parent or legal guardian, a student
- 20 shall be excused from all or parts of the Internet safety
- 21 curriculum instruction. The principal shall notify all parents
- 22 or legal quardians of their ability to withdraw their children
- 23 from instruction in the curriculum by returning a signed opt-out
- 24 form.
- 25 (g) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 26 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 27 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 "Office of Attorney General." The Office of Attorney General
- 30 of the Commonwealth.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
