## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of March 14 through 20, 2021, as "Sunshine 2 Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The currently enacted version of Pennsylvania's
- 4 Sunshine Act developed from legislation introduced in and
- 5 originally passed by the Senate in 1998; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Right-to-Know Law also has its
- 7 genesis in the Senate, with legislation introduced and passed as
- 8 Senate Bill 1 in 2008; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Both the Sunshine Act and the Right-to-Know Law
- 10 ensure public access to government information through public
- 11 meetings and public documents; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Public access to meetings and records is fundamental
- 13 to our residents' ability to be well-informed of government
- 14 actions and to hold government officials accountable; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Sunshine Act requires public agencies to hold
- 16 public meetings any time a quorum deliberates agency business or
- 17 takes official action; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Sunshine Act requires public agencies to allow
- 2 the public to comment on matters of agency business and to
- 3 record public meetings; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Right-to-Know Law is based on the presumption
- 5 that records in possession of government agencies are public
- 6 records and must be provided to the public within the framework
- 7 of the law; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Right-to-Know Law provides residents with a
- 9 fair, simple, no-cost method to appeal when a request has been
- 10 denied; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of March 14
- 12 through 20, 2021, as "Sunshine Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 13 further
- 14 RESOLVED, That all residents of this Commonwealth are urged
- 15 to join in this observance of the basic principles of an open
- 16 and accessible government in a free society.
