A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of March 2021 as "Problem Gambling Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Individuals across the country and in this
- 4 Commonwealth enjoy the recreational aspects of legalized
- 5 gambling; and
- 6 WHEREAS, For some individuals and families, gambling becomes
- 7 an issue affecting and disrupting the lives of these individuals
- 8 and their families; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The National Council of Problem Gambling (NCPG)
- 10 reports that 2% to 3% of the United States population, which
- 11 equates to between 6 million and 9 million Americans, are
- 12 considered problem gamblers; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Problem gambling is a public health issue affecting
- 14 individuals of all ages, races and ethnic backgrounds in all
- 15 communities and has a significant societal and economic cost;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, Problem gambling is treatable, and treatment is
- 18 effective in minimizing the harm to individuals, families and

- 1 society as a whole; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Only a limited number of individuals affected by
- 3 problem gambling seek treatment options and utilize existing
- 4 problem-gambling programs; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Numerous individuals, professionals and
- 6 organizations have dedicated their efforts to public awareness
- 7 of problem gambling and the availability and effectiveness of
- 8 treatment; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The proliferation of unregulated slot-machine-like
- 10 devices in nearly every community across this Commonwealth,
- 11 especially in vulnerable communities, is contributing to
- 12 gambling addiction; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Unregulated gambling devices demand increased focus
- 14 on compulsive and problem gambling awareness and the education
- 15 of residents of this Commonwealth on gambling addiction as a
- 16 public health issue, which affects Pennsylvanians of all ages
- 17 and backgrounds; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The NCPG is coordinating the annual "Problem
- 19 Gambling Awareness Month" campaign in March to educate the
- 20 public about the impact of problem gambling and the availability
- 21 of treatment options; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of March 2021
- 23 as "Problem Gambling Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 24 further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Pennsylvania Gaming
- 26 Control Board to continue its outreach efforts and work with the
- 27 Pennsylvania gaming industry to develop and implement problem-
- 28 gambling programs and further promote community-based programs
- 29 in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Department of Health in

- 1 conjunction with the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs,
- 2 the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board and individuals,
- 3 professionals and organizations dedicated to public awareness
- 4 and treatment of problem gambling to jointly create, develop and
- 5 promote public awareness campaigns regarding the recognition and
- 6 prevention of problem gambling; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize that problem gambling is
- 8 a public health issue impacting residents in this Commonwealth
- 9 in a harmful way that needs to be addressed in a reasonable and
- 10 responsible manner; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all residents of this
- 12 Commonwealth to learn more about problem gambling and the
- 13 programs available to help individuals and their families who
- 14 have been adversely affected by this issue.
