A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of March 2021 as "Music in Our Schools Month," "Theatre in Our Schools Month," "Dance in Our Schools
- Month" and "Youth Art Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, Arts education experiences have substantive effects
- 5 on student academic, social and emotional outcomes; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Social and emotional learning skills are more
- 7 necessary than ever as the world emerges from the COVID-19
- 8 pandemic; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Research and studies have shown that engagement in
- 10 arts education has a positive impact on student discipline,
- 11 standardized writing scores and compassion and empathy for
- 12 others; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Every Student Succeeds Act recognizes fine arts
- 14 programs as fulfilling the requirement that each school provide
- 15 a well-rounded education to their students; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, students in grades K-12 must
- 17 be provided with instruction in fine arts disciplines, including
- 18 music, dance, theatre and visual art; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Students who took four years of art classes in high
- 2 school scored an average of 92 points higher on their SATs than
- 3 their peers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Students with high levels of arts involvement are
- 5 less likely to drop out of school; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Disadvantaged students who receive an arts education
- 7 are three times more likely to earn a bachelor's degree than
- 8 students who lack those experiences; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The study of music engages students in their
- 10 creative, cultural, aesthetic, intellectual, social, physical
- 11 and emotional development; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Music education helps develop students' skills
- 13 critical to 21st century learning for success in school and
- 14 life; and
- 15 WHEREAS, These skills are integral to the economy of this
- 16 Commonwealth; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The National Association for Music Education is
- 18 leading the conversation nationwide on the importance of quality
- 19 music education in our schools; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Theatre education teaches invaluable skills needed
- 21 to be successful in the workforce, including the ability to
- 22 listen, artistic sense, nonverbal communication, enthusiasm and
- 23 storytelling; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Drama instruction integrated into elementary
- 25 classrooms improves students' social and emotional development
- 26 and contributes to a positive classroom culture; and
- 27 WHEREAS, English language learners in kindergarten through
- 28 second grade who received weekly drama lessons demonstrated
- 29 increased listening and speaking skills on standardized tests;
- 30 and

- 1 WHEREAS, Reading play scripts out loud has been found to help
- 2 at-risk middle school students become better readers; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Only 28% of public high schools in high-poverty
- 4 areas offer theatre instruction; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Educational Theatre Association envisions every
- 6 student will have access to theatre taught by qualified
- 7 educators as a vital part of a well-rounded education and is
- 8 dedicated to shaping lives through theatre education; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Education in the art of dance develops the knowledge
- 10 and skills required to create, perform and understand movement
- 11 as a means of artistic communication; and
- 12 WHEREAS, A comprehensive education in dance includes
- 13 improvisation, technique, choreography, performance, observation
- 14 and analysis; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Dance education engages the artistic processes of
- 16 creating, performing and critical analysis by requiring students
- 17 to read symbol systems, use critical thinking skills, excel in
- 18 nonverbal reasoning and communication, exchange ideas, work
- 19 cooperatively and collaboratively with others and interact in a
- 20 multicultural society; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Student achievement, teacher satisfaction and school
- 22 culture are improved through dance education as demonstrated by
- 23 increased reading and STEM test scores, improved memory
- 24 retention and cognitive connections and enhanced teacher and
- 25 school morale; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The National Dance Education Organization is
- 27 dedicated to advancing dance education for individuals of all
- 28 backgrounds; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Visual arts education is valuable in developing
- 30 divergent and critical thinking, multicultural awareness and

- 1 technical, communication and expressive skills among students;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Council for Art Education promotes quality
- 4 school visual art education programs in grades K-12 across the
- 5 United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Council for Art Education "Youth Art Month"
- 7 theme for 2021 is "Art Connects Us"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, "Youth Art Month" exists to recognize art education
- 9 as a viable factor in the total education curriculum and to
- 10 direct attention to the value of art education for divergent and
- 11 critical thinking; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of March 2021
- 13 as "Music in Our Schools Month," "Theatre in Our Schools Month,"
- 14 "Dance in Our Schools Month" and "Youth Art Month" in
- 15 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize schools and certified
- 17 arts educators in their efforts to provide more robust,
- 18 comprehensive arts education curriculum for students in grades
- 19 K-12; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the positive impact that
- 21 music, theatre, dance and visual art education has on
- 22 communities and students across this Commonwealth to help raise
- 23 awareness regarding the need for access to quality programs for
- 24 all students regardless of socioeconomic status, race, ethnicity
- 25 or ability.
