A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a 1 study of the economic, environmental and health impacts 2 relating to development of the critical mineral industry in this Commonwealth. 4 5 WHEREAS, Critical minerals and rare earth elements are vital to the economy and the technological development of society; and 6 7 WHEREAS, China and other foreign entities dominate the global market on critical minerals; and 8 9 WHEREAS, These foreign actors produce the minerals in 10 unregulated and unsafe manners that can lead to long-lasting harm to the environment, and may pose a threat to national 11 12 security and the global supply chain; and 13 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has an abundance of critical 14 minerals from waste material from coal mining; and 15 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University has been 16 researching and developing cutting-edge processes to extract critical minerals and rare earth elements from coal waste and 17 other material to extract these elements; therefore be it 18

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Joint State Government
- 2 Commission to conduct a study examining critical mineral and
- 3 rare earth elements extraction, particularly from coal waste and
- 4 other waste materials, including:
- 5 (1) the estimated availability of critical minerals and
- 6 rare earth elements in this Commonwealth;
- 7 (2) the technology and infrastructure necessary to
- 8 extract critical minerals and rare earth elements; and
- 9 (3) the estimated economic value of the critical
- 10 minerals and rare earth elements;
- 11 and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission report
- 13 on potential environmental and health impacts that may arise
- 14 from the development of the critical mineral industry in
- 15 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission examine
- 17 the activities of other states relating to critical mineral and
- 18 rare earth elements extraction, particularly from coal waste and
- 19 other waste materials; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission provide
- 21 recommendations on how the Commonwealth might address the
- 22 development of the critical mineral industry in Pennsylvania;
- 23 and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission submit a
- 25 report within one year of the adoption of this resolution.
