## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2022 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 4 million abuse and neglect
- 4 referrals are made to child protection agencies involving more
- 5 than 4.3 million children in the United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In 2020, there were 4,593 substantiated cases of
- 7 child abuse in this Commonwealth, with 73 children dying as a
- 8 direct result of abuse and neglect and 115 children nearly
- 9 losing their lives; and
- 10 WHEREAS, These tragic numbers reflect the unsettling reality
- 11 that thousands of children in this Commonwealth go to bed hurt,
- 12 hungry, cold and alone or live every day in fear of the very
- 13 people who should be protecting them; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Although the General Assembly has passed measures in
- 15 recent years to bolster screening for caregivers, improve
- 16 reporting, stiffen penalties and fortify investigations, child
- 17 abuse and neglect remain, and the secretiveness which surrounds

- 1 child abuse and neglect in far too many families in this
- 2 Commonwealth is especially difficult to combat; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic, service interruptions and
- 4 Statewide virtual schooling aided in this crisis by decreasing
- 5 the number and frequency of our teachers, friends and the public
- 6 having eyes on our children, catching warning signs of abuse and
- 7 intervening to prevent deaths; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The heroin and opioid epidemic, which continues to
- 9 claim the lives of 14 Pennsylvanians every day, often victimizes
- 10 the children of parents struggling with addiction, with infants
- 11 and young children frequently left unsupervised and unsupported
- 12 in the most unsafe and unsanitary of conditions; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Child abuse crosses all racial, economic and
- 14 geographic boundaries; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The damaging effects of child abuse include school
- 16 failure, alcohol and drug abuse and physical and psychological
- 17 difficulties; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Child abuse can and must be prevented and awareness
- 19 raised so that families can learn that they have access to
- 20 community resources which offer support, information and
- 21 guidance to help stop or prevent abusive behaviors or
- 22 conditions; and
- 23 WHEREAS, By working to enhance awareness of child abuse and
- 24 prevent and end abusive behaviors and environments, we
- 25 demonstrate our collective commitment to breaking the vicious
- 26 cycle of abuse and creating a safe, nurturing, loving
- 27 environment for every infant and child in this Commonwealth; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvanians in schools, social service
- 29 agencies, churches and neighborhood groups throughout this
- 30 Commonwealth are working to support the victims of child abuse

- 1 and prevent future abuse; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In spite of these efforts, more needs to be done to
- 3 guarantee a childhood free of abuse and victimization to every
- 4 child in this Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2022
- 6 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate commend the individuals, agencies,
- 9 churches and community groups that work to treat and prevent
- 10 child abuse, and urge all Pennsylvanians to do their part in
- 11 preventing the tragedy of child abuse.
