## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2022 as "Alcohol Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Most adults in the United States who drink alcohol
- 4 do so moderately and without complications, yet alcohol-related
- 5 problems are among the most significant public health issues in
- 6 the country; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Alcohol use disorder (AUD) affects about 15 million
- 8 adults in the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, An estimated 88,000 people die from alcohol-related
- 10 causes annually, making alcohol the third most preventable cause
- 11 of death in the nation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America kicked off
- 13 a month-long campaign with its Alcohol-Free Weekend to raise
- 14 public awareness about the use of alcohol and how it affects
- 15 individuals, families, businesses and communities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, This year, the theme led by the Community Anti-Drug
- 17 Coalitions of America is, "For the Health of It: Early Education

- 1 on Alcoholism and Addiction," which highlights that alcohol
- 2 remains the number one drug of choice for America's youth and is
- 3 more likely to kill young people than all illegal drugs
- 4 combined; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the 2019 National Survey on Drug Use
- 6 and Health, an estimated 414,000 adolescents 12 to 17 years of
- 7 age had AUD; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the same study, nearly 7 million people
- 9 12 to 20 years of age reported drinking alcohol in the past
- 10 month and approximately 825,000 people 12 to 20 years of age
- 11 reported heavy alcohol use in the past month; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Alcohol use during the teenage years can interfere
- 13 with normal adolescent brain development, increase the risk of
- 14 developing AUD, and lead to unintended consequences such as
- 15 injury, sexual assault, alcohol overdose and death; therefore be
- 16 it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2022
- 18 as "Alcohol Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Senate inform Pennsylvanians of the
- 20 dangers associated with alcohol use and abuse in adults and
- 21 children.
