A RESOLUTION

- Designating May 18, 2022, as "Emergency Medical Services for Children Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 30 million children receive emergency
- 4 medical care each year due to illness or injury; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The needs of children are different than the needs
- 6 of adults in medical emergencies; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The goal of the national Emergency Medical Services
- 8 for Children (EMSC) Program is to help states and communities
- 9 prepare for an emergency involving a child through the provision
- 10 of pediatric-ready emergency departments and emergency medical
- 11 services agencies; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The EMSC Program supports research and improvement
- 13 science to drive transformation of emergency care systems; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The EMSC Program relies on established partnerships
- 15 within the emergency medical services community, as well as
- 16 multidisciplinary teams of health care providers across the
- 17 emergency care continuum, to help states and communities reduce

- 1 child and youth disability and death due to severe illness or
- 2 injury; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The EMSC Program, including the many prehospital and
- 4 hospital-based practitioners and families served by the program
- 5 and the professional organizations and Federal agencies which
- 6 partner with the program, are committed to ensuring the delivery
- 7 of high-quality emergency care for children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, It is proper and timely to bring recognition to the
- 9 value and accomplishments of the EMSC Program and the dedicated
- 10 personnel who work tirelessly to improve the delivery of
- 11 pediatric care across emergency care systems; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 18, 2022, as
- 13 "Emergency Medical Services for Children Day" in Pennsylvania.
