1 2 3 4	Amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in real estate foreclosure, providing for code compliance notice following sheriff's sale.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 68 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 2307.1. Code compliance notice following sheriff's sale.
10	(a) NoticeThe Department of Labor and Industry shall
11	prepare and provide a code compliance notice for each county in
12	this Commonwealth. The following apply:
13	(1) The notice shall be provided to each county sheriff
14	within 30 days of the effective date of this paragraph.
15	(2) The notice may be provided electronically to a
16	sheriff's office if the Department of Labor and Industry can
17	confirm receipt of the notice.
18	(3) The notice for each county shall include, but not be
19	limited to, the following:

1	(i) A list of municipalities in each county with the
2	following information for each municipality:
3	(A) General contact information for the
4	municipality.
5	(B) If the municipality has elected to enforce
6	the Uniform Construction Code under the act of
7	November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the
8	Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, and:
9	(I) For municipalities that have elected to
10	enforce the Uniform Construction Code, the name
11	and contact information for the building code
12	official and whether the municipality has enacted
13	amendments to the Uniform Construction Code.
14	(II) For municipalities that have elected
15	not to enforce the Uniform Construction Code, the
16	contact information for the appropriate Uniform
17	Construction Code staff at the Department of
18	Labor and Industry.
19	(ii) Plain language information about compliance
20	with the Uniform Construction Code and the permits that
21	may be required before construction on a property can
22	commence. The information under this subparagraph shall
23	include a statement that the purchaser should contact the
24	building code official or the Department of Labor and
25	Industry, whichever is applicable for the municipality
26	where the property is located, to obtain additional
27	information about the requirements of the Uniform
28	Construction Code.
29	(iii) Plain language information explaining that
30	municipalities may have enacted municipal zoning

1	ordinances or other municipal ordinances, which may
2	require a permit, a variance or other compliance measures
3	before construction on a property may commence. The
4	information under this subparagraph shall include a
5	statement that the purchaser should contact the
6	municipality where the property is located to obtain
7	additional information about how to comply with municipal
8	<u>requirements.</u>
9	(iv) Any other relevant information that the
10	Department of Labor and Industry deems appropriate to
11	provide the purchaser of a property at a sheriff's sale.
12	(b) Duty of sheriffA sheriff shall provide the code
13	compliance notice required under subsection (a) to any purchaser
14	of a property at a sheriff's sale. The code compliance notice
15	shall be posted on the sheriff's publicly accessible Internet
16	website, in the location where other information about sheriff's
17	sales is displayed, and the notice shall be made available to
18	prospective purchasers attending a sheriff's sale.
19	(c) UpdatesThe Department of Labor and Industry shall be
20	responsible for updating the code compliance notices under_
21	subsection (a) on an annual basis. The following apply:
22	(1) The updated notice shall be provided to each county
23	sheriff prior to December 31 each year, beginning the year
24	after the notice required by subsection (a) is provided for
25	the first time.
26	(2) The updated notice may be provided electronically to
27	a sheriff's office if the Department of Labor and Industry
28	can confirm receipt of the updated notice.
29	(d) ApplicationThe provisions of this section shall apply
30	to properties purchased or sold in accordance with the

1	provisions of the act of May 16, 1923 (P.L.207, No.153),
2	referred to as the Municipal Claim and Tax Lien Law, and the act
3	of July 7, 1947 (P.L.1368, No.542), known as the Real Estate Tax
4	Sale Law.
5	Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
6	(1) The addition of 68 Pa.C.S. § 2307.1(b) shall take
7	effect in 151 days.
8	(2) This section shall take effect immediately.
9	(3) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 120
10	days.
