## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Public Arts Grant Program and the Public Arts
- Fund; conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department
- of Community and Economic Development; and making an
- 4 appropriation.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public Arts
- 9 Grant Program Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Community organization." A nonprofit organization that
- 15 partners with artists who reside in this Commonwealth with an
- 16 established goal and purpose to improve their community.
- 17 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic

- 1 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 2 "Fund." The Public Arts Fund established under section 4.
- 3 "Program." The Public Arts Grant Program established under
- 4 section 3.
- 5 Section 3. Public Arts Grant Program.
- 6 (a) Establishment. -- The Public Arts Grant Program is
- 7 established within the department.
- 8 (b) Powers and duties of department.--The department shall
- 9 provide grants under the program in accordance with this act to
- 10 community organizations and artists for the creation of public
- 11 art that is free and accessible to the public and depicts or
- 12 benefits historically marginalized communities.
- 13 Section 4. Public Arts Fund.
- 14 (a) Establishment. -- The Public Arts Fund is established as a
- 15 separate account in the State Treasury. The fund shall be
- 16 administered by the department to provide grants under the
- 17 program.
- 18 (b) Continuing appropriation. -- Money in the fund is
- 19 appropriated on a continuing basis to the department for
- 20 purposes of the program.
- 21 Section 5. Applications.
- 22 (a) Development and availability. -- Grant application forms
- 23 shall be developed by the department and made available on the
- 24 department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 25 (b) Contents of form. -- At a minimum, the grant application
- 26 form shall contain the following information:
- 27 (1) The name, address and contact information of the
- 28 community organization or artist.
- 29 (2) The amount of grant money requested.
- 30 (3) A detailed description of the proposed public art

- 1 installation, including murals, sculptures, statues and
- 2 temporary public art installations.
- 3 (4) An explanation of how the proposed public art
- 4 installation will be free to the public and how the public
- 5 will be able to access the proposed public art installation
- 6 produced with the grant money.
- 7 (5) Proof of any permits required by a municipality or
- 8 permission or permits from another government entity,
- 9 including a school district or political subdivision.
- 10 (6) A timeline of the proposed public art installation,
- including a proposed completion date.
- 12 (7) Any other information that the department deems
- 13 necessary and appropriate.
- 14 (c) Compliance. -- The department shall verify in writing on
- 15 each grant application that the application complies with all
- 16 requirements under section 6.
- 17 Section 6. Requirements.
- 18 The following shall apply:
- 19 (1) Grants shall be awarded by the department to
- 20 eligible community organizations and artists who have been
- 21 approved by the department.
- 22 (2) Grants may only be given to community organizations'
- headquarters in this Commonwealth.
- 24 (3) Proposed public art installations must be completed
- within three years of the award of the grant. If a proposed
- 26 public art installation is not completed within three years,
- 27 the department may take action to retrieve the awarded grant.
- The department may grant a one-year extension to a proposed
- 29 art installation if the project experienced delays not the
- 30 fault of the community organization or artist.

- 1 Section 7. Administration.
- 2 The department shall develop guidelines for the
- 3 implementation of the program.
- 4 Section 8. Award of grants.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- The department shall award grants to
- 6 eligible community organizations and artists who have been
- 7 approved by the department.
- 8 (b) Amount.--Grant amounts may not exceed a maximum of
- 9 \$100,000 for each community organization or artist approved by
- 10 the department.
- 11 Section 9. Appropriation.
- The sum of \$10,000,000 is appropriated to the fund from the
- 13 General Fund to carry out the purposes of this act.
- 14 Section 10. Effective date.
- 15 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
