## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), entitled "An act defining the liability of an employer to pay damages for injuries received by an employe in the course of employment; 3 establishing an elective schedule of compensation; providing 4 procedure for the determination of liability and compensation thereunder; and prescribing penalties," in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in 7 liability and compensation, providing for compensation for 8 post-traumatic stress injury. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 109 of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, is amended by 13 14 adding definitions to read: 15 Section 109. In addition to the definitions set forth in 16 this article, the following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless 17 the context clearly indicates otherwise: 18

- 1 <u>"First responder" means any of the following public servants:</u>
- 2 (1) An emergency medical services provider or EMS provider,
- 3 <u>as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 8103 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 4 (2) An active volunteer, employe or member of a fire
- 5 company, as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 7802 (relating to
- 6 <u>definitions</u>).
- 7 (3) A Pennsylvania State Police officer.
- 8 (4) A peace officer as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 501 (relating
- 9 <u>to definitions</u>).
- 10 \* \* \*
- 11 "Post-traumatic stress injury" shall have the meaning given
- 12 <u>in 35 Pa.C.S. § 75A01 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 13 \* \* \*
- 14 Section 2. Section 301 of the act is amended by adding a
- 15 subsection to read:
- 16 Section 301. \* \* \*
- 17 (q) (1) A claim for a post-traumatic stress injury suffered
- 18 by a first responder shall establish that the injury was
- 19 <u>sustained in the course and scope of the individual's employment</u>
- 20 as a first responder. A post-traumatic stress injury suffered by
- 21 a first responder does not need to be the result of an abnormal
- 22 working condition in order to be compensable.
- 23 (2) A post-traumatic stress injury suffered by an individual
- 24 under paragraph (1) shall be based on assessment and diagnosis
- 25 by a licensed medical professional or a licensed mental health
- 26 professional whose scope of practice includes evaluation,
- 27 <u>assessment and diagnostic privileges as outlined by the scope of</u>
- 28 practice of the profession under the laws and regulations of
- 29 this Commonwealth.
- 30 (3) A claim for a post-traumatic stress injury must be filed

- 1 within three years of the date of a diagnosis under paragraph
- 2 (2).
- 3 (4) When a post-traumatic stress injury is diagnosed after
- 4 the last date of employment, paragraph (1) shall not be
- 5 construed to prohibit a claim against the employer of the
- 6 claimant at the time of the direct exposure to the traumatic
- 7 event which caused the injury.
- 8 (5) For purposes of this subsection, a post-traumatic stress
- 9 <u>injury suffered as a result of an employment action, including</u>
- 10 disciplinary action, job or performance evaluation, job
- 11 <u>transfers or employment termination</u>, shall not be compensable.
- 12 Section 3. The amendment or addition of sections 109 and
- 13 301(g) of the act shall apply to claims filed on or after the
- 14 effective date of this section.
- 15 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
