.5	"Legislative plagiarism" shall mean the practice of
-6	introducing legislation that is identical in form and substance
_7	to legislation that was previously introduced by another sitting

- 1 member of the House in the same legislative session or
- 2 immediately prior legislative session without written
- 3 permission.

- 5 RULE 18
- 6 Introduction and Printing of Bills
- 7 Bills shall be introduced in quadruplicate, signed and dated
- 8 by each member who is a sponsor of the bill, and filed with the
- 9 Chief Clerk on any day that the offices of the House of
- 10 Representatives are open for business. A sponsor may be added or
- 11 withdrawn, but in the case of withdrawals, the names shall be
- 12 withdrawn if and when the bill is reprinted.
- 13 Bills introduced when received at the Chief Clerk's desk
- 14 shall be numbered consecutively and delivered to the Speaker,
- 15 who shall refer each bill to an appropriate committee on any day
- 16 whether or not the House is in session. If the resolution
- 17 creating a select committee authorizes the referral of bills to
- 18 that committee, the Speaker may refer bills, within the scope of
- 19 the resolution, to such select committee. Insofar as applicable,
- 20 the select committee shall consider and report bills in
- 21 accordance with the rules governing the consideration and
- 22 reporting of bills by standing committees. The Speaker shall
- 23 report to the House the committees to which bills have been
- 24 referred, either on the day introduced or received or on the
- 25 next two legislative days the House is in session, unless the
- 26 House is in recess for more than four consecutive days in which
- 27 case the Speaker shall provide a list to the Majority Leader and
- 28 the Minority Leader, within two calendar days, of all bills
- 29 which were referred during such period when the House was not in
- 30 session.

- 1 If the Speaker neglects or refuses to refer to committee any
- 2 bill or bills (whether House or Senate) as above after
- 3 introduction or presentation by the Senate for concurrence, any
- 4 member may move for the reference of the bill to an appropriate
- 5 committee. If the motion is carried, said bill or bills shall be
- 6 immediately surrendered by the Speaker to the committee
- 7 designated in said motion.
- 8 The first copy of each bill introduced shall be for the
- 9 committee, the second copy shall be for the printer, the third
- 10 copy shall be for the news media and the fourth copy shall be
- 11 for the Legislative Reference Bureau.
- 12 Every bill, after introduction and reference to committee,
- 13 shall be printed and shall also be posted on the Internet with
- 14 the hyperlink to the web page for the members of the House of
- 15 Representatives.
- Bills may not be withdrawn after reference to committee.
- 17 <u>A bill or resolution that meets the definition of legislative</u>
- 18 plagiarism may not be introduced. If a bill or resolution is
- 19 introduced that is suspected of being legislative plagiarism,
- 20 the matter may be referred to the Committee on Ethics.
