9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. The heading of Subchapter B of Chapter 32 and
11	sections 3211, 3212, 3213, 3214, 3216 and 3217 of Title 51 of
12	the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
13	SUBCHAPTER B
14	MEDICAL OFFICER OR HEALTH CARE
15	OFFICER INCENTIVE PROGRAM
16	§ 3211. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
18	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
19	context clearly indicates otherwise:
20	["Behavioral health officer." An officer who:

1	(1) holds a license to practice psychology under the act
2	of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), known as the Professional
3	Psychologists Practice Act, or is a licensed clinical social
4	worker as defined in section 3 of the act of July 9, 1987
5	(P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and
6	Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act;
7	(2) has malpractice insurance, is self-insured or
8	maintains insurance through a private employer; and
9	(3) meets any applicable Federal requirements for the
10	Pennsylvania National Guard.
11	"Medical officer or health officer." An officer who is any
12	of the following:
13	(1) A resident physician.
14	(2) A physician.
15	(3) A physician assistant.
16	(4) A behavioral health officer.
17	(5) A public health officer or environmental science
18	officer.]
19	"Health care officer." An officer who serves in one of the
20	United States Air Force's following health care professions:
21	(1) Doctor.
22	(2) Nurse.
23	<u>(3) Dentist.</u>
24	(4) Allied Health.
25	(5) Administration.
26	"Medical officer." An officer who serves in one of the
27	<u>United States Army Medical Department's six corps:</u>
28	(1) Dental Corps.
29	(2) Medical Corps.
30	(3) Medical Services Corps.

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1	(4) Medical Specialist Corps.
2	<u>(5) Nurse Corps.</u>
3	(6) Veterinary Corps.
4	"Member in good standing." A member of the Pennsylvania
5	National Guard who meets all medical, training, physical and
6	educational requirements for service and who is a satisfactory
7	participant in all scheduled duties and training periods.
8	["Physician." An officer assigned to and serving in an
9	authorized Army Medical Corps or Air Force Medical Corps
10	position who:
11	(1) has completed a medicine residency program; and
12	(2) is currently practicing medicine in the United
13	States or its territories.
14	"Physician assistant." An officer who:
15	(1) is licensed as a physician assistant under the act
16	of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical
17	Practice Act of 1985; and
18	(2) meets any applicable Federal requirements for the
19	Pennsylvania National Guard.]
20	"Program." The Medical Officer or Health <u>Care</u> Officer
21	Incentive Program.
22	["Public health officer" or "environmental science officer."
23	An officer who holds a minimum of a bachelor's degree from an
24	educational program accredited by an agency recognized by the
25	United States Secretary of Education in an environmental science
26	related field of study, including any of the following majors or
27	their equivalent:
28	(1) Environmental science, environmental health or
29	environmental management.
30	(2) Occupational health.

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1 (3) Industrial hygiene.
2 (4) Public health.
3 (5) Sanitary science or epidemiology.
4 (6) Biology, chemistry, toxicology, geology,
5 microbiology, biochemistry or zoology.
6 "Resident physician." An officer who:
7 (1) is assigned to a medical position in the
8 Pennsylvania National Guard;
9 (2) is a medical doctor or doctor of osteopathy
10 participating in graduate training;
(3) holds a license to practice medicine under the
12 Medical Practice Act of 1985; and
13 (4) meets any applicable Federal requirements for the
14 Pennsylvania National Guard.]
15 § 3212. Establishment of program.
16 The Medical Officer or Health <u>Care</u> Officer Incentive Program
17 is established within the department to provide educational
18 stipends to eligible medical officers or health <u>care</u> officers in
19 accordance with the provisions of this subchapter.
20 § 3213. Program stipend.
21 (a) General rule
22 [(1) A resident physician, physician or physician
23 assistant who meets the requirements under subsection (c) may
receive a stipend of \$1,000 per month for no more than 48
25 months of medicine residency or the first 36 accession months
of service to the Pennsylvania National Guard.
(2) A behavioral health officer, public health officer
28 or environmental science officer who meets the requirements
29 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$500 per month
30 for no more than the first 36 accession months of service to
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1 the Pennsylvania National Guard.] (3) A medical officer or health care officer who is 2 required to have obtained a doctoral degree for entry into 3 the officer's military specialty and who meets the 4 5 requirements under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$1,000 per month for no more than 48 months of medicine 6 residency or the first 36 accession months of service to the 7 8 Pennsylvania National Guard. 9 (4) A medical officer or health care officer who is required to have obtained a master's degree for entry into 10 the officer's military specialty who meets the requirements 11 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$750 per month 12 13 for no more than 48 months of medicine residency or the first 14 36 accession months of service to the Pennsylvania National 15 Guard. 16 (5) A medical officer or health care officer who is 17 required to have obtained a bachelor's degree for entry into 18 the officer's military specialty who meets the requirements 19 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$500 per month 20 for no more than 48 months of medicine residency or the first <u>36 accession months of service to the Pennsylvania National</u> 21 22 Guard. Areas of concentration. -- An area of concentration 23 (b) 24 qualification for a medical or health officer must be approved 25 by the National Guard Bureau through a predetermination request 26 completed by the Pennsylvania Army National Guard Army Medical 27 Department Officer Strength Manager or the Pennsylvania Air_ 28 National Guard State Air Surgeon. 29 (b.1) Eligibility.--Medical officers and health care officers assigned to administrative, planning or logistical 30 20230SB0162PN0043 - 5 -

1 concentrations shall not be eligible for the program.

2 (c) Requirements.--In order to qualify for a stipend under 3 subsection (a), a medical officer or health <u>care</u> officer shall 4 meet all of the following:

5 (1) Be a member in good standing with the Pennsylvania
6 National Guard.

7 (2) Be assigned to an appropriate medical or health
8 position in the Pennsylvania National Guard.

9 (3) Agree to serve as a medical officer or health <u>care</u> 10 officer in the Pennsylvania National Guard [after completion 11 of residency or initial service obligation] for a period of 12 one month for each monthly stipend received. This service 13 obligation shall be concurrent with any other military 14 service obligation of the officer.

15 (4) Meet Federal and State licensing requirements to
 practice within the officer's medical specialty within the
 17 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

18 (5) Meet any applicable Federal requirements for the
 19 Pennsylvania National Guard.

20 (6) Once licensed and eligible to be granted, maintain
21 clinical privileges as awarded at the national guard level by
22 the Centralized Credentials and Privileging Preparation Board
23 (C2P2).

(d) Receipt of stipend.--A stipend under subsection (a)
shall be paid to an eligible medical officer or health <u>care</u>
officer whose application for the stipend is approved at the
completion of each month of residency or service. A medical
officer or health <u>care</u> officer may not receive a stipend under
subsection (a) for more than 48 months during the period of
service in the Pennsylvania National Guard.

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1 Adjustments.--If the Adjutant General determines that (e) 2 the amount available for the program in any year will be 3 insufficient to provide stipends in the amount described under subsection (a), the Adjutant General may place a cap on the 4 number of medical officers or health care officers eligible to 5 receive stipends or may adjust the amount of the annual stipend. 6 7 (f) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall be 8 construed to prohibit a medical officer or health care officer who is serving in the Pennsylvania National Guard before the 9 10 effective date of this section and who meets the requirements under subsection (c) from receiving a stipend under subsection 11 12 (a) during the period of [medicine] medical residency or 13 service.

14 § 3214. Additional incentives.

To the extent that funds are available, the Adjutant General may, by regulation, establish additional incentives to aid in the recruitment and retention of medical officers or health <u>care</u> officers in the Pennsylvania National Guard, provided that payment of such additional incentives shall not result in a cap on participation or reduction in the amount of stipends paid under section 3213 (relating to program stipend).

22 § 3216. Recoupment of incentive payments.

23 (a) General rule. -- A recipient of a stipend or other 24 incentive payment under this subchapter who fails to complete 25 [his] the recipient's service obligation or to meet other 26 requirements established by the Adjutant General is liable to the Commonwealth for repayment of all incentive payments made. 27 28 The Adjutant General shall notify the department if the 29 recipient fails to complete the service obligation, and the promissory note under section 3215 (relating to promissory note) 30

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shall be called to secure payment in full upon demand on a
 schedule as the department may determine.

3 (b) Forgiveness of recoupment. -- The Adjutant General may forgive recoupment of all or part of a recipient's stipend or 4 other incentive payment if the Adjutant General determines that 5 [his] the recipient's failure to fulfill the service obligation 6 7 was the result of [his] the recipient's death, discharge because 8 of disability incurred in line of duty, discharge because of a medical determination that [he] the recipient is medically unfit 9 10 for duty when the medical condition is outside [his] the recipient's control and is not due to [his] the recipient's 11 misconduct, mandatory discharge, release or retirement for age 12 13 or years of service or discharge, release, transfer or 14 retirement because of other compelling circumstances outside [his] the recipient's control. 15

16 § 3217. Adjustment of stipend amounts.

17 Beginning on January 1, [2016] 2024, and every [two] five 18 years thereafter, the Adjutant General may adjust, by notice 19 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, the amounts of the 20 stipends set forth in this subchapter by an amount equal to the 21 change in the applicable Consumer Price Index in the preceding 22 [two] <u>five</u> years provided that the Adjutant General finds 23 sufficient funds are appropriated and available to pay for the 24 adjusted stipends.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
