AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing for public job posting database, for instructional vacancy 5
- 6
- data and for data transparency; and establishing the Educator 7
- Pipeline Support Grant Program.
- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 11
- 12 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
- 13 to read:
- Section 130. Public Job Posting Database. -- (a) The 14
- department shall establish and maintain a public database for 15
- 16 school entities or nonpublic schools to voluntarily advertise
- 17 employe vacancies on the department's publicly accessible
- 18 Internet website. The database shall, at a minimum:
- 19 (1) Allow a school entity or nonpublic school to post in
- real time an employe vacancy. The department shall determine 20

- 1 <u>information to be required as part of a posting.</u>
- 2 (2) Provide for a time-limited expiration of a posting made
- 3 by a school entity or nonpublic school.
- 4 (3) Be searchable by, at a minimum, county, intermediate
- 5 <u>unit, school entity, grade level, employe type and academic</u>
- 6 <u>content area.</u>
- 7 (4) Be made available at no cost to a school entity,
- 8 <u>nonpublic school or prospective employe.</u>
- 9 (b) A school entity or nonpublic school may submit a posting
- 10 to the database established under subsection (a) for an open
- 11 position or an anticipated open position.
- 12 (c) The department may contract with a third party to
- 13 operate the database established under subsection (a).
- 14 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 16 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 17 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 18 Commonwealth.
- 19 "Employe." The following:
- 20 (1) A "professional employe" as defined in section 1101(1).
- 21 (2) A paraprofessional or educational interpreter as
- 22 described under 22 Pa. Code § 14.105 (relating to personnel).
- 23 (3) Any other employe in a school entity or nonpublic school
- 24 as determined by the department.
- 25 "Nonpublic school." As defined in section 923.3-A(b).
- 26 "School entity." A school district, charter school, regional
- 27 charter school, intermediate unit or area career and technical
- 28 school operating within this Commonwealth.
- 29 Section 131. Instructional Vacancy Data. -- (a) The
- 30 <u>department shall require a school entity to submit certain</u>

- 1 <u>information relating to instructional vacancies</u>, including, at a
- 2 minimum, the number of instructional vacancies, the number of
- 3 <u>emergency permits utilized by a school entity and the number of</u>
- 4 positions occupied by long-term substitutes. The department
- 5 shall determine the form and manner in which the information is
- 6 to be submitted by a school entity. To the best extent possible,
- 7 the department shall utilize existing reporting methods to
- 8 collect this data. By August 31, 2023, and each August 31
- 9 thereafter, each school entity shall report the following to the
- 10 <u>department:</u>
- 11 (1) The total budgeted complement of instructional employes
- 12 for that fiscal year and vacancies included in the final adopted
- 13 <u>budget of a board of school directors.</u>
- 14 (2) The quarterly average number of instructional employe
- 15 <u>vacancies the school entity had during the school year.</u>
- 16 (b) The department shall maintain the information collected
- 17 <u>under subsection (a) on its publicly accessible Internet</u>
- 18 website.
- 19 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 20 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 21 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 23 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 24 "School entity." A school district, charter school, regional
- 25 <u>charter school</u>, <u>intermediate unit or area career and technical</u>
- 26 <u>school operating within this Commonwealth.</u>
- 27 <u>Section 132. Data Transparency. -- (a) To the extent that</u>
- 28 funding is made available, no later than December 31 of each
- 29 year, the department shall post on its publicly accessible
- 30 Internet website data related to the educator workforce in this

- 1 Commonwealth that allows members of the public to view,
- 2 disaggregate and manipulate the following data if collected by
- 3 the department:
- 4 (1) Educator supply data, including educator preparation
- 5 provider enrollment and completion data and education
- 6 professional certificates issued by the department,
- 7 <u>disaggregated by categories</u>, including program, certification
- 8 <u>area and demographic information.</u>
- 9 (2) Educator demand data, including current educator
- 10 workforce numbers, unfilled positions and rates, new hires and
- 11 emergency permits or out-of-field educators, disaggregated by
- 12 <u>categories</u>, including school entity, school, specific
- 13 <u>assignment</u>, <u>certification area</u>, <u>type of emergency permit and</u>
- 14 <u>demographic information</u>.
- 15 (3) Educator preparation program outcomes data, including
- 16 <u>data on percentage of program enrollees who:</u>
- 17 (i) Complete the program.
- 18 (ii) Pass the certification test on the first time and
- 19 <u>overall</u>.
- 20 (iii) Receive certification.
- 21 (iv) Are employed by a school entity in years one through
- 22 <u>five.</u>
- 23 (v) Are retained by a school entity in years one through
- 24 <u>five.</u>
- 25 (4) Educator retention at one-year, three-year and five-year
- 26 rates, disaggregated by categories, including school entity,
- 27 <u>school, specific assignment, certification area, type of</u>
- 28 <u>emergency permit and demographic information.</u>
- 29 (b) The department may contract with an outside organization
- 30 to meet the requirements of this section.

- 1 (c) No later than December 15, 2023, and each December 15
- 2 thereafter, the department, in consultation with the Department
- 3 <u>of Labor and Industry, shall issue a report to the Governor and</u>
- 4 General Assembly on the educator workforce in this Commonwealth.
- 5 The report shall be posted on the department's publicly
- 6 <u>accessible Internet website. The report shall include</u>
- 7 information on:
- 8 (1) Trends in educator supply and educator preparation
- 9 provider effectiveness, including recommendations for attracting
- 10 more high-quality and diverse teacher candidates and improving
- 11 the quality of educator preparation in this Commonwealth.
- 12 (2) The educator positions, by certification area, in high
- 13 <u>demand in this Commonwealth and the location of existing</u>
- 14 <u>vacancies by school entity.</u>
- 15 (3) Projections of shortage areas and subjects in the
- 16 upcoming three to five years and recommendations for addressing
- 17 these shortages.
- 18 (4) Overall and disaggregated trends in educator retention,
- 19 including recommendations for improving retention.
- 20 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 21 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 22 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 23 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 24 Commonwealth.
- 25 "School entity." A school district, cyber charter school,
- 26 charter school, regional charter school, area career and
- 27 <u>technical school or intermediate unit.</u>
- 28 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 29 ARTICLE XII-B
- 30 EDUCATOR PIPELINE SUPPORT GRANT PROGRAM

- 1 <u>Section 1201-B. Scope of article.</u>
- 2 This article relates to educator workforce.
- 3 Section 1202-B. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 7 <u>"Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance</u>
- 8 Agency.
- 9 <u>"Approved educator preparation program." A sequence of</u>
- 10 courses and experiences offered by an institution of higher
- 11 education that is reviewed and approved by the department.
- 12 "Cooperating teacher." An individual who satisfies all of
- 13 the following:
- 14 <u>(1) Holds a certification under section 1201 in the</u>
- 15 <u>subject area in which the individual will be providing</u>
- 16 guidance to the student teacher.
- 17 (2) Has received at least three years of satisfactory
- 18 ratings as a certified teacher.
- 19 (3) Has at least one year of certificated teaching
- 20 experience in the school entity where the student teacher is
- 21 placed.
- 22 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 23 Commonwealth.
- "Institution of higher education." A college or university
- 25 that offers a program approved by the department to prepare
- 26 professional personnel for employment in a school entity in
- 27 <u>accordance with 22 Pa. Code Ch. 49 (relating to certification of</u>
- 28 professional personnel).
- 29 "Nonpublic school." As defined in section 923.3-A(b).
- 30 "Program." The Educator Pipeline Support Grant Program

- 1 established under section 1203-B.
- 2 <u>"School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area</u>
- 3 career and technical school, charter school, regional charter
- 4 <u>school or cyber charter school operating within this</u>
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 <u>"Student teacher."</u> An individual participating in a
- 7 <u>classroom teaching experience who, as part of an approved</u>
- 8 <u>educator preparation program for the initial or advanced</u>
- 9 preparation of professional educators, performs classroom
- 10 teaching or assists in a school entity's or nonpublic school's
- 11 <u>education program under the supervision of a cooperating</u>
- 12 teacher.
- 13 Section 1203-B. Program establishment and duties of agency.
- 14 (a) Establishment.--The Educator Pipeline Support Grant
- 15 Program is established within the agency.
- 16 (b) Duties. -- The agency, in consultation with the
- 17 department, shall administer the program and, in the agency's
- 18 sole discretion, award a grant to an individual who submits a
- 19 completed application and satisfies the eligibility requirements
- 20 under section 1204-B.
- 21 (c) Application. -- No later than 120 days after the effective
- 22 date of this subsection, the agency shall develop and make
- 23 available an application form that an individual who is seeking
- 24 placement as a student teacher may use to apply for a grant
- 25 under the program.
- 26 <u>(d) (Reserved)</u>.
- (e) Grant amount.--
- 28 (1) A student teacher shall receive a minimum grant of
- 29 \$10,000.
- 30 (2) A payment received by an individual under this

- 1 article shall not be included in classes of income under
- 2 section 303 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known
- 3 as the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
- 4 <u>(f) Additional grant amount for certain areas.--</u>
- 5 (1) An eligible student teacher who completes required
- 6 <u>student teaching in a school entity in an area of this</u>
- 7 <u>Commonwealth that attracts few student teachers or that has a</u>
- 8 <u>high rate of open teaching positions shall, in addition to</u>
- 9 <u>the amount awarded under subsection (e)(1), receive a minimum</u>
- grant amount of \$5,000. The agency, in consultation with the
- department, shall utilize data from the department to
- 12 <u>determine the areas identified in this paragraph.</u>
- 13 (2) For the purposes of computing the tax under Article
- 14 III of the Tax Reform Code of 1971, the classes of income
- 15 <u>under section 303 of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 shall not</u>
- include a payment received by an individual under this
- 17 article.
- 18 <u>(q)</u> Funding.--
- 19 (1) The agency shall use money appropriated for the
- 20 purpose of the program and may accept funding from public and
- 21 <u>private sources, including the Federal Government, for the</u>
- 22 payment of grants under this section.
- 23 (2) If the agency determines that the demand for the
- 24 program exceeds the available resources, the agency may
- 25 request additional funding as part of the agency's budget
- 26 request for the next fiscal year in accordance with section
- 27 610 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as
- The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 29 (h) Additional duties. -- When the agency awards a grant to a
- 30 student teacher under this article, the agency shall also award

- 1 <u>a grant payment to the student teacher's cooperating teacher.</u>
- 2 The cooperating teacher shall receive a minimum grant of \$1,000.
- 3 The agency may reduce the grant award amount to a cooperating
- 4 teacher if the cooperating teacher receives compensation from an
- 5 <u>institution of higher education for serving as a cooperating</u>
- 6 <u>teacher</u>. An institution of higher education may not charge a
- 7 student teacher for the cost of paying a cooperating teacher.
- 8 (i) Dissemination of information. -- The agency shall annually
- 9 provide information about the program on the department's
- 10 publicly accessible Internet website and to all approved
- 11 educator preparation programs and public and nonpublic secondary
- 12 schools. An approved educator preparation program shall annually
- 13 disseminate information about the program, including information
- 14 identifying the school entities that qualify the student for an
- 15 additional grant award amount under section 1203-B(f).
- 16 (j) Payment. -- The agency shall establish a method for paying
- 17 grant awards under the program to a school entity or nonpublic
- 18 school. The school entity or nonpublic school shall use all of
- 19 the money received under the program for payment to student
- 20 teachers and cooperating teachers as required by this section
- 21 and the agency.
- 22 (k) Administrative fee. -- The agency may take a reasonable
- 23 administrative fee for direct costs associated with the
- 24 implementation, administration and servicing of the program. The
- 25 fee shall be taken from the funding received under subsection
- 26 (g) and may not exceed 5%.
- 27 <u>Section 1204-B. Eligibility.</u>
- 28 <u>(a) Eligibility.--For an individual to be eligible for a</u>
- 29 grant under the program, the individual shall meet all of the
- 30 following:

- 1 (1) Be currently enrolled in an institution of higher
- 2 <u>education located in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 3 <u>(2) Be currently enrolled in an approved educator</u>
- 4 <u>preparation program.</u>
- 5 (3) Meet the minimum grade point average established
- 6 <u>under 22 Pa. Code § 354.24 (relating to academic</u>
- 7 <u>performance</u>).
- 8 (4) Be placed in a position as a student teacher at a
- 9 <u>school entity or nonpublic school located in this</u>
- 10 Commonwealth.
- 11 (5) Have obtained the necessary clearances required
- 12 <u>under section 111 and 23 Pa.C.S. § 6344(a.1) (relating to</u>
- 13 <u>employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster</u>
- 14 <u>parents</u>).
- 15 (6) Agree to work as a teacher at a school entity or
- 16 <u>nonpublic school in this Commonwealth for a period of no less</u>
- 17 than three years, unless the agency determines that there are
- 18 <u>extenuating circumstances.</u>
- 19 (b) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall be deemed
- 20 to create a right of an individual to receive a grant under the
- 21 program.
- 22 (c) Limitation. -- An individual may not receive more than one
- 23 grant from the agency under the program.
- 24 Section 1205-B. Report.
- 25 (a) General rule. -- The agency shall prepare and submit to
- 26 the Governor, the Secretary of Education and the General
- 27 Assembly no later than December 31, 2024, and each December 31
- 28 thereafter, to the extent that funds are available, a report
- 29 detailing the operation of the program. The report shall, at a
- 30 <u>minimum</u>, include:

- 1 (1) The number of applicants.
- 2 (2) The number of applicants who received a grant under
- 3 the program.
- 4 (3) The number of applicants who received an additional
- 5 <u>award under section 1203-B(f).</u>
- 6 (4) A list of school entities or nonpublic schools where
- 7 <u>an applicant served as a student teacher.</u>
- 8 (5) A list of approved educator preparation programs
- 9 <u>where applicants who were awarded a grant were enrolled.</u>
- 10 (6) A list of school entities where grantees are
- 11 <u>employed following certification.</u>
- 12 (7) The number of applicants who did not fulfill the
- requirements under section 1204-B(a)(6).
- 14 (8) Any other information the agency determines.
- 15 (b) Coordination. -- The department and the Department of
- 16 Labor and Industry shall assist the agency by providing
- 17 necessary data to determine outcomes related to the program.
- 18 Section 1206-B. Data collection.
- 19 (a) Student teaching placement data. -- The department shall
- 20 maintain a database of student teaching opportunities for the
- 21 upcoming school year. The following shall apply to the database:
- 22 (1) A school entity or nonpublic school who is
- 23 interested in hosting a student teacher may submit to the
- department the number of student teachers the school entity
- or nonpublic school is seeking for the upcoming school year.
- 26 If a school entity's or nonpublic school's request for
- 27 <u>student teachers from the previous school year was not</u>
- fulfilled, the school entity or nonpublic school may report
- the shortage of requested student teachers.
- 30 (2) Each approved educator preparation program shall

1	submit to the department the number of student teachers
2	placed by the approved educator preparation program in the
3	previous school year. If the approved educator preparation
4	program had more requests for student teachers than available
5	student teachers, the approved educator preparation program
6	shall report the shortage of available student teachers to
7	the department.
8	(3) No later than July 31, 2023, and each July 31
9	thereafter, each approved educator preparation program shall

1	(i) The number of agreements between approved
.2	educator preparation programs and school entities or
13	nonpublic schools for the purpose of placing student

22	(b) (Reserved).
23	Section 1207-B. Miscellaneous provisions.
24	(a) Institutions of higher education Within one year of
25	the effective date of this section, if an institution of higher
26	education requires a student enrolled in an approved educator
27	preparation program to take a class or seminar as part of the
28	student teaching experience while the student is participating
29	in a student teaching program, the institution of higher
30	education shall provide the student with the ability to

- 1 participate in the class or seminar by virtual means.
- 2 (b) Credit.--If a student teacher receives a stipend, an
- 3 approved educator preparation program may not prohibit the
- 4 <u>student teacher from receiving academic credit for participating</u>
- 5 <u>in a student teacher experience if the student teacher</u>
- 6 <u>successfully completes the student teaching experience.</u>
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
