A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the members of the Congress of the United States to
- support Federal legislation to admit Washington, DC, into the
- Union as a state of the United States of America.
- 4 WHEREAS, The people living on the land that would eventually
- 5 be designated as the District of Columbia were provided the
- 6 right to vote for representation in Congress when the United
- 7 States Constitution was ratified in 1788; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The passage of the Organic Act of 1801 placed the
- 9 District of Columbia under the exclusive authority of the United
- 10 States Congress and abolished residents' right to vote for
- 11 members of Congress and the President and Vice President of the
- 12 United States; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Residents of the District of Columbia were granted
- 14 the right to vote for President and Vice President of the United
- 15 States through passage of the 23rd Amendment to the United
- 16 States Constitution in 1961; and
- 17 WHEREAS, As of 2021, the United States Census Bureau data
- 18 estimates that the District of Columbia's population, at

- 1 approximately 689,545 residents, is comparable to the
- 2 populations of Wyoming (576,851), Vermont (643,077), Alaska
- 3 (733,391) and North Dakota (779,094); and
- 4 WHEREAS, Residents of the District of Columbia share all the
- 5 responsibilities of United States citizenship, including paying
- 6 more Federal taxes than residents of 22 states, service on
- 7 Federal juries and defending the United States as members of the
- 8 United States armed forces in every war since the War for
- 9 Independence, yet residents of the District of Columbia are
- 10 denied full representation in Congress; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Residents of the District of Columbia have endorsed
- 12 statehood for the District of Columbia and passed a district-
- 13 wide referendum on November 8, 2016, which favored statehood by
- 14 86%; and
- 15 WHEREAS, No other democratic nation denies the right of self-
- 16 government, including participation in national legislature, to
- 17 the residents of this nation's capital; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Residents of the District of Columbia lack full
- 19 democracy, equality and citizenship enjoyed by the residents of
- 20 the 50 states; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The United States Congress repeatedly has interfered
- 22 with the District of Columbia's limited self-government by
- 23 enacting laws that affect the District of Columbia's expenditure
- 24 of locally raised tax revenue, including barring the usage of
- 25 locally raised revenue, thus violating the fundamental principle
- 26 that states and local governments are best suited to enact
- 27 legislation that represents the will of the residents; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Although the District of Columbia has passed
- 29 consecutive balanced budgets since fiscal year 1997, the
- 30 District of Columbia still faces the possibility of being shut

- 1 down yearly because of congressional deliberations over the
- 2 Federal budget; and
- 3 WHEREAS, District of Columbia Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton
- 4 and Delaware United States Senator Tom Carper introduced in the
- 5 117th Congress H.R. 51 and S. 51, the Washington, DC, Admission
- 6 Act, that provides that the State of Washington, DC, would have
- 7 all the rights of citizenship as taxpaying American citizens,
- 8 including two Senators and at least one House member; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The United Nations Human Rights Committee has called
- 10 on the United States Congress to address the District of
- 11 Columbia's lack of political equality, and the Organization of
- 12 American States has declared the disenfranchisement of the
- 13 District of Columbia's residents a violation of its charter
- 14 agreement, to which the United States is a signatory; therefore
- 15 be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 17 urge the members of the Congress of the United States to enact
- 18 Federal legislation granting statehood to the people of
- 19 Washington, DC; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania support
- 21 admitting Washington, DC, into the Union as a state of the
- 22 United States of America; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to the
- 24 President of the United States, the Vice President of the United
- 25 States, the President pro tempore of the United States Senate,
- 26 the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and to
- 27 each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
