A RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to
- conduct a study evaluating the outcomes of Act 44 of 2018 and
- to issue a report of its findings and recommendations.
- 4 WHEREAS, Act 44 of 2018 established the School Safety and
- 5 Security Grant Program and the Safe2Say Program and formed the
- 6 School Safety and Security Committee in the Pennsylvania
- 7 Commission on Crime and Delinquency; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Act 44 of 2018 undoubtedly had much success in
- 9 better protecting the lives of our children, teachers and school
- 10 visitors throughout this Commonwealth and providing schools with
- 11 the resources they need; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The intent of this resolution is to improve upon the
- 13 successes of Act 44 of 2018 and help support potential future
- 14 policy recommendations for the programs and services established
- 15 under Act 44 of 2018; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and
- 17 Finance Committee to conduct a study evaluating the outcomes of
- 18 Act 44 of 2018 and include all of the following information,
- 19 using the most recent data available, regarding the program:

- 1 (1) The average dollar amount that school entities 2 received through the program with intent to provide safety 3 and security services.
 - (2) An analysis of other relevant data sources on school safety and student mental health, including Statewide and county data from the Pennsylvania Youth Survey, as well as data on school discipline.
 - (3) Using aggregate data, an analysis of types of programs and services that schools applied for using their grant money, aligned with items and activities included in section 1306-B(j) of the Public School Code of 1949.
 - (4) An assessment of the baseline criteria adopted by the School Safety and Security Committee for physical security and behavioral health.
- 15 (5) A review of the standards required for school
 16 resource officers and school police officers in Article XIII17 C of the Public School Code of 1949, including a comparison
 18 to national standards.
 - (6) A compilation of the Risk and Vulnerability
 Assessment Teams and the third-party vendors of the number of assessments conducted under 1307-B of the Public School Code of 1949 over the last five years.
- 23 (7) A review of the registration data and qualifications 24 of school safety and security assessment providers in section 25 1304-B of the Public School Code of 1949 and compare to 26 national standards.
- 27 (8) A review of the safety and security best practices 28 of other states;
