HOUSE 1531 2301

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in adoption, further providing for alternative procedure for relinquishment. (Representatives D. MILLER, MURT, WATSON and others) – Children & Youth, June 8, 2016

VOTE



This bill amends Title 23 by eliminating the requirement to hold a hearing to confirm consent to an adoption and empowering the court to confirm the consent and enter a decree of termination of parental rights and duties.

HOUSE 1532 2302

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in adoption, further providing for the definition of "intermediary." (Representatives ACOSTA, BISHOP, WATSON and others) - Children & Youth, June 8, 2016

VOTE

(C)

This bill amends the definition of "intermediary" in adoption law to include a licensed attorney or social worker who is acting in that capacity.

HOUSE 1290 1721

An Act amending Titles 53 (Municipalities Generally), 66 (Public Utilities) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in taxicabs and limousines in first class cities, further providing for definitions; in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in powers and duties, providing for financial responsibility of transportation network companies; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; providing for transportation network service; and, in general provisions, further providing for definitions. (Representatives MAHER, VEREB, KILLION and others) - Consumer Affairs, May 18, 2016

OVER

This bill amends Titles 53, 66 & 75 by establishing licensing requirements and service standards for transportation network companies.

SENATE 874

1334

An Act amending the act of August 14, 1963 (P.L.1059, No.459), referred to as the Cemetery and Funeral Merchandise Trust Fund Law, further providing for deposits into merchandise trust funds; providing for price and description reports; and further providing for funds held in trust, for payments from merchandise trust funds, for filing of financial reports and for penalty. (Senators McGARRIGLE, TOMLINSON, RAFFERTY and others) - Consumer Affairs, May 2, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Cemetery and Funeral Merchandise Trust Fund Law to modify the process governing the sale of cemetery and funeral merchandise and to prohibit pre-need delivery except in certain situations.

SENATE 307

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in organization of departmental administrative boards and commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, further providing for the Environmental Quality Board. (Senators YUDICHAK, FONTANA, COSTA and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, April 11, 2016 15

OVER

This bill amends The Administrative Code of 1929 to provide for the Environmental Quality Board.

SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

HOUSE 1246 1640

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives YOUNGBLOOD, CRUZ, DONATUCCI and others) – Finance, June 6, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to tax all lottery winnings.

OVER

This bill amends the Professional Nursing Law pertaining to the delegation of certain nursing care tasks.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, in medical professional liability, providing for emergency care. (Representatives EVANKOVICH, CUTLER, SACCONE and others) - Insurance, May 23, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Act to provide qualified immunity to a health care provider who delivers emergency health care services.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1339 182

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in burglary and other criminal intrusion, providing for the offense of criminal surveillance. (Representatives PYLE, KOTIK, WARNER and others) – Judiciary, May 16, 2016

OVER

This bill amends Title 18 providing for the offense of criminal surveillance.

SENATE 747

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, further providing for punitive damages; providing for punitive damages study; and imposing duties on the Insurance Commissioner. (Senators VOGEL, WHITE, SCARNATI and others) – Judiciary, June 6, 2016

OVER

This bill provides for punitive damages.

SENATE 898

An Act amending the act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.723, No.230), known as the Second Class County Code, in fiscal affairs, further providing for limits on counties of the second class. (Senators HUTCHINSON, EICHELBERGER, McGARRIGLE and others) – Local Government, June 8, 2016

OVER

This bill provides for limits on counties of the second class in fiscal affairs.

SENATE 899

1065

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for limitation on tax increase after countywide reassessment. (Senators HUTCHINSON, EICHELBERGER, McGARRIGLE and others) - Local Government, June 8, 2016

OVER

This bill provides for limitation on tax increase after countywide reassessment.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

HOUSE 1415

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, further providing for definitions, for reciprocity, for restriction on the use of title "licensed clinical social worker," for penalties and for unlawful practice; and repealing provisions related to appropriation. (Representatives MICCARELLI, FRANKEL, YOUNGBLOOD and others) - Professional Licensure, June 8, 2016

VOTE



This bill creates a licensing board to regulate the professions.

An Act amending the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), known as the Professional Psychologists Practice Act, further providing for definitions, for necessity for license, for qualifications for license, for refusal, suspension or revocation of license and for reporting of multiple licensure; making editorial changes; and making a related repeal. (Senators GORDNER, BREWSTER, BLAKE and others) – Professional Licensure, June 8, 2016

This bill provides for definition and for temporary license.

SENATE

837

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, further providing for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors, for restriction on the use of title "Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist" and for penalties. (Senators AUMENT, RAFFERTY, SMITH and others) - Professional Licensure, June 8, 2016

VOTE



This bill provides title protection to Marriage and Family Therapists licensed by the State Board of Social Workers.

OVER

This bill permits public employees with a religious objection to send their fair share fees to any recognized nonreligious 501C3 charity of their choosing.

OVER

This bill requires that a public employer shall provide notice prior to signing a proposed collective bargaining agreement.
