

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILLS

HOUSE 780 1263

An Act amending Title 7 (Banks and Banking) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in mortgage loan industry licensing and consumer protection, further providing for definitions, for license requirements, for exceptions to license requirements, for general requirements, for powers conferred on certain licensees engaged in the mortgage loan business, for mortgage loan business prohibitions, for application for license, for license fees and for licensee requirements and providing for the promulgation of regulations to effectively incorporate Federal regulations. (Representatives MACKENZIE, THOMAS, ELLIS and others) - Commerce, April 19, 2017

This bill amends Title 7 to provide for mortgage loan industry licensing and consumer protection.

HOUSE 1039 1203

An Act authorizing certain financial institutions to conduct savings promotion raffles; and providing for enforcement by the Department of Banking and Securities. (Representatives R. BROWN, CALTAGIRONE, DAY and others) - Commerce, April 19, 2017

VOTE



This bill authorizes certain financial institutions to conduct savings promotion raffles and provides for enforcement by the Department of Banking and Securities.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILL**

**HOUSE 179** 

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; and, in violations and penalties, further providing for unauthorized operation by carriers and brokers. (Representatives DAY, KNOWLES, D. COSTA and others) - Consumer Affairs, March 20, 2017

OVER

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL**

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in terms and courses of study, further providing for agreements with institutions of higher education; in opportunities for educational excellence, further providing for definitions, for responsibilities of school entities and for concurrent enrollment agreements; and, in charter schools, extensively revising and adding charter school provisions. (Representatives REESE, DUNBAR, HICKERNELL and others) - Education, April 19, 2017

VOTE



This bill amends the Public School Code to extensively revise and add provisions regarding charter school entities.



An Act amending the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1200, 108 No.202), known as the Solicitation of Funds for Charitable Purposes Act, further providing for exemptions from registration. (Representatives MOUL, MILLARD, PICKETT and others) - Finance, **April 19, 2017**




This bill amends the Solicitation of Funds for Charitable Purposes Act by outlining what does not constitute fundraising activities under Section 6(a)(3) relating to exemption from registration.

**HOUSE** 674

An Act amending the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, in State lottery, providing for 720 lottery winnings intercept. (Representatives BERNSTINE, A. HARRIS, O'NEILL and others) - Finance, April 19, 2017

VOTE



This bill amends the State Lottery Law to provide for a PA Lottery winnings intercept for state delinquent taxes and outstanding court costs.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILLS

**HOUSE 125** 

An Act providing for the use of certain credentialing applications, for credentialing requirements for health insurers and for protections for enrollees of health insurers; imposing penalties; and conferring powers and imposing duties on the Insurance Department and Department of Health. (Representatives BAKER, BARRAR, CUTLER and others) - Health, April 19, 2017



This bill provides for the use of certain credentialing applications, for credentialing requirements for health insurers and for protections for enrollees of health insurers.

HOUSE **508** 

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in public assistance, prohibiting eligibility for violators of sexual offender registration. (Representatives COX, BARRAR, D. COSTA and others) – Health, April 19, 2017

This bill provides for public assistance, prohibiting eligibility for violators of sexual offender registration.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE 217** 

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in offenses against the family, further providing for the offense of endangering welfare of children. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, BAKER, STEPHENS and others) – Judiciary, April 17, 2017



An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in theft and related offenses, defining the offense of theft of secondary metal; and prescribing penalties. (Representatives METCALFE, JAMES, WHEELAND and others) - Judiciary, April 17, 2017


This bill amends Title 18 by adding the offense of theft of secondary metal.

others) – Judiciary, April 17, 2017

This bill directs the PA Commission on Sentencing to provide for a sentence enhancement for the offense of indecent exposure when the offense is committed while a person under the age of 16 is present.

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; and, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, providing for spirit expanded permits. (Representatives REESE, TURZAI, BENNINGHOFF and others) - Liquor Control, April 17, 2017

OVER

This bill amends Title 47 to provide for expanded spirit sales and a new definition.




This bill amends the Fiscal Code to require any agency or other entity that is the subject of an audit by the Auditor general to respond to the audit within 120 days.
