This bill adds postpartum depression as a qualifying at-risk condition for early intervention services under the Early Intervention Services System Act.

OVER

This bill provides for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts.

OVER

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

(Representatives MUSTIO, D. COSTA, DeLUCA and others) – **Gaming Oversight, June 5, 2017** **2**

This bill amends the Local Option Small Games of Chance Act to allow non-profits affiliated with an international airport to hold 50/50 raffles within the airport.

This bill establishes standards for the certification of all drug and alcohol recovery houses that receive state or federal funds and to monitor/inspect recovery houses to ensure compliance.
