#### SECOND CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILL

HOUSE 1213 1486

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts and providing for standards of redress in appeals. (Representatives KAMPF, GODSHALL, McGINNIS and others) - Commerce, June 27, 2017

OVER

This bill provides for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE **179** 

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; and, in violations and penalties, further providing for unauthorized operation by carriers and brokers. (Representatives DAY, KNOWLES, D. COSTA and others) - Consumer Affairs, June 27, 2017

OVER

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILLS

SENATE 144 1051

An Act amending the act of January 24, 1966 (1965 P.L.1535, No.537), known as the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, further providing for official plans. (Senators YAW, BARTOLOTTA, VOGEL and others) – Environmental Resources & Energy, July 7, 2017 1

VOTE

This bill amends the PA Sewage Facilities Act to provide for the use of alternate on lot septic systems for site development plans.



**SENATE 646** 

An Act amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), known as the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act, in recycling fee, further providing for recycling fee for municipal waste landfills and resource recovery facilities and for Recycling Fund. (Senators KILLION, FONTANA, GREENLEAF and others) – Environmental Resources & Energy, July 7, 2017 1

OVER

This bill amends the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act to eliminate the sunset date for the recycling fee for municipal waste landfills and resource recovery facilities.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

HOUSE 332

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives GROVE, BLOOM, NELSON and others) – Finance, June 22, 2017

OVER

This bill provides for classes of income.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILL

**SENATE 446** 

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, providing for certified drug and alcohol recovery houses and establishing the Certified Drug and Alcohol Recovery House Account. (Senators McGARRIGLE, YAW, SCARNATI and others) - Human Services, June 29, 2017

VOTE

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This bill amends the Administrative Code to require the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs to license or certify drug and alcohol recovery houses which receive public funding.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 1286

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, in medical professional liability, providing for punitive damages study. (Representatives MENTZER, ZIMMERMAN, HICKERNELL and others) – Insurance, June 30, 2017 2

OVER

This bill provides for punitive damages study.

HOUSE 1576 2064

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.789, No.285), known as The Insurance Department Act of 1921, providing for limited lines travel insurance. (Representatives PICKETT AND DeLUCA) - Rules, June 21, 2017

OVER

This bill provides for limited lines travel insurance.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives CUTLER, DEAN, DRISCOLL and others) – Judiciary, June 27, 2017

OVER

This bill is a summary of proposed legislation and is prepared only as general information for use by the Republican Members and staff of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives.

HOUSE

2 / 4 1497 An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, further providing for relief. (Representatives MARSICO, READSHAW, KNOWLES and others) – Judiciary, June 22, 2017

OVER

This bill amends the Protection From Abuse Act to add another type of relief for the plaintiff by allowing the court to order the defendant to refrain from abusing the plaintiff's cat or dog.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 641

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assessments of persons and 1712 property, providing for senior property tax freeze. (Representatives GROVE, SCHWEYER, JAMES and others) - Local Government, June 7, 2017

OVER

This bill establishes an Optional Senior Property Tax Freeze program.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

**SENATE 527** 

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, establishing the Office 911 of State Inspector General. (Senators AUMENT, REGAN, SCARNATI and others) - State Government, July 7, 2017

OVER

This bill creates an Independent Office of Inspector General.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** TRANSPORTATION BILL

**SENATE 553** 

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for surrender of license, for period of disqualification, revocation or suspension of operating privilege, for driving while operating privilege is suspended or revoked, for chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance, for probationary license and for ignition interlock limited license; and, in driving after imbibing alcohol or utilizing drugs, further providing for penalties, for ignition interlock and for illegally operating a motor vehicle not equipped with ignition interlock. (Senator RAFFERTY) - Transportation, June 30, 2017

VOTE



This bill is an omnibus amendment to current DUI laws.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILL**

HOUSE 984

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further 1806 providing for operational provisions. (Representatives MAKO, BIZZARRO, CHARLTON and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, July 7, 2017

VOTE

This bill provides for operational provisions.

OVER

This bill makes an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board.

OVER

This bill makes an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board.
