HOUSE **593**

OVER

This bill provides for Second Stage Loan Program.

HOUSE 1213

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts and providing for standards of redress in appeals. (Representatives KAMPF, GODSHALL, McGINNIS and others) – Commerce, September 25, 2017

OVER

This bill provides for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts.

OVER


