





This bill amends the Crime Victims Act to further provide for attendance of a victim at trial.





#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS



 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time, further providing for twenty year limitation. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McGINNIS, WARD and others) - Judiciary, February 5, 2018

This bill amends the Judicial Code to eliminate the expiration date on the limitations period for actions on instruments under seal.

SENATE 449 1424 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for probable cause arrests in domestic violence cases. (Senators BARTOLOTTA, TARTAGLIONE, VULAKOVICH and others) - Judiciary, February 5, 2018 1

This bill amends the Crimes Code to allow a court of common pleas to use a risk assessment tool when determining whether to allow bail in a criminal case involving domestic violence.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL



An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in liability and compensation, further providing for prescription drugs and the treatment of work-related injuries; and, in procedure, further providing for peer review. (Senators WHITE, SCARNATI, REGAN and others) - Labor & Industry, February 5, 2018 1

This bill amends the Workers' Compensation Act to require the Dept. of Labor & Industry to adopt an evidence-based prescription drug formulary and require Utilization Review Organizations & Peer Review Organizations be accredited or certified by a nationally-recognized organization selected by Labor & Industry.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for authority to issue liquor licenses to hotels, restaurants and clubs, for sale of malt or brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases and sales and for premises to be vacated by patrons. This bill amends Title 47 to allow club license holders to sell six packs to their members.


