




HOUSE 274 1497 An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, further providing for relief. (Representatives MARSICO, READSHAW, KNOWLES and others) - Judiciary, February 6, 2018 1

This bill amends the Protection From Abuse Act to add another type of relief for the plaintiff by allowing the court to order the defendant to refrain from abusing the plaintiff's cat or dog.

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries)
of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property and legal title and equitable estate, further providing for right to dispose of a decedent's remains. (Representatives READSHAW, BARBIN, KORTZ and others) - Rules, November 27, 2017 13

This bill amends the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code to provide for "majority rule" in decisions regarding the disposition of a decedent's remains.



This bill amends the Crimes Code to allow a court of common pleas to use a risk assessment tool when determining whether to allow bail in a criminal case involving domestic violence.




