### SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN & YOUTH BILLS

HOUSE 1539 3311

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in standby guardianship, further providing for definitions and for scope and providing for temporary guardianship; in child protective services, further providing for release of information in confidential reports; and making editorial changes. (Representatives PASHINSKI, DRISCOLL, THOMAS and others) - Children & Youth, April 16, 2018

VOTE



This bill allows a grandparent, or other family member, of a child to petition a court of common pleas for temporary guardianship of that child when a parent has entered a rehabilitation facility for treatment of drug or alcohol addiction.

HOUSE 2133 3107

An Act establishing the Kinship Caregiver Navigator Program in the Department of Human Services; and providing for kinship caregiver navigator website and for kinship caregiver navigators. (Representatives WATSON, PASHINSKI, CONKLIN and others) - Children & Youth, April 16, 2018

VOTE

(C)

This bill establishes the Kinship Caregiver Navigator Program.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILLS

HOUSE **593** 

An Act amending Title 64 (Public Authorities and Quasi-Public Corporations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth Financing Authority, further providing for Second Stage Loan Program. (Representatives THOMAS, DRISCOLL, McNEILL and others) - Rules, January 24, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for Second Stage Loan Program.

HOUSE 1213 1486

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts and providing for standards of redress in appeals. (Representatives KAMPF, GODSHALL, McGINNIS and others) - Commerce, March 13, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts.

HOUSE 1284

An Act providing for the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal within the Department of Community and Economic Development. (Representatives PEIFER, PICKETT, DRISCOLL and others) - Commerce, April 10, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal within the Department of Community and Economic Development; and establishing the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal Advisory Board.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE **179** 

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; and, in violations and penalties, further providing for unauthorized operation by carriers and brokers. (Representatives DAY, KNOWLES, D. COSTA and others) - Consumer Affairs, March 13, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

**HOUSE 332** An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives GROVE, BLOOM, NELSON and others) - Finance, February 6,2018 OVER This bill provides for classes of income. **HOUSE** An Act amending the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, in local taxes, further providing for delegation of taxing powers and restrictions thereon; and, in consolidated collection of local income taxes, OVER further providing for declaration and payment of income taxes. (Representatives PEIFER, DUNBAR, FARRY and others) - Finance, March 14, 2018 The bill amends the Local Tax Enabling Act related to the consolidated collection of local income taxes. HOUSE An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known 1105 as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in realty transfer tax, further providing for definitions and for exempt parties. (Representatives RYAN, BARRAR, BOBACK and others) - Rules, January 24, OVER 2018 This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to clarify the realty transfer tax exemption for veteran's organizations. **HOUSE** An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, providing for volumetric severance tax; and making a related repeal. (Representatives DiGIROLAMO, DeLISSIO, MURT and others) - Finance, January 24, 2018 OVER This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to provide a natural gas severance tax. **HOUSE** An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, repealing 1772 provisions relating to contribution for Korea/Vietnam Memorial National Education Center and further providing for operational OVER provisions. (Representatives COX, PETRARCA, DRISCOLL and others) - Finance, February 5, 2018

This bill repeals provisions relating to contribution for Korea/Vietnam Memorial National Education Center and further providing for operational provisions.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **HEALTH BILLS**

HOUSE 358

An Act providing for a volunteer health care practitioner certification; and imposing powers and duties on the Department 376 of Health. (Representatives BAKER, PICKETT, MURT and others) - Health, March 14, 2018

OVER

This bill creates the Volunteer Health Care Practitioner Act.

**HOUSE** 1933

An Act prohibiting certain benefit packages for children's health care and medical assistance to include gender or sex reassignment surgery or gender or sex transition services. (Representatives TOPPER, BAKER, BARRAR and others) - Health, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill creates the Taxpayer-Funded Genera or Sex Reassignment Services Act.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILL**

**HOUSE** 

1024

An Act amending the act of October 7, 2010 (P.L.484, No.70), known as the Adult Protective Services Act, in reporting suspected 2518 abuse by employees, providing for Statewide adult abuse registry. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BIZZARRO, BOBACK and others) - Human Services, December 13, 2017

OVER

This bill establishes a statewide adult abuse registry within the Department of Human Services.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS**

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.789, No.285), known as The Insurance Department Act of 1921, in insurance producers, further providing for definitions and providing for self-service storage insurance. (Representatives CHARLTON, DRISCOLL, WATSON and others) - Insurance, April 16, 2018

VOTE

This bill provides for self-service storage facility insurance.

**HOUSE** 

**1286** 

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Meare) Act in medical reserved. (Mcare) Act, in medical professional liability, providing for punitive damages study. (Representatives MENTZER, ZIMMERMAN, HICKERNELL and others) - Insurance, April 10, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for punitive damages study.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 1576

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.789, No.285), known as The Insurance Department Act of 1921, providing for limited lines travel insurance. (Representatives PICKETT AND DeLUCA) - Rules, February 5, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for limited lines travel insurance.

SENATE 630

An Act providing for the licensure of limited lines travel insurance producers, for requirements for sale of travel insurance, for authority of limited lines travel insurance producers, for registration and training of travel retailers and for renewal of license. (Senators RESCHENTHALER, SCARNATI, BREWSTER and others) – Insurance, April 16, 2018

VOTE



This bill provides for eligibility of officers of a corporation deemed to be self-employed persons.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 111 1699

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives CUTLER, DEAN, DRISCOLL and others) – Judiciary, March 13, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by changing and adding provisions related to selection of justices and judges.

1497

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, further providing for relief. (Representatives MARSICO, READSHAW, KNOWLES and others) – Judiciary, February 6, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Protection From Abuse Act to add another type of relief for the plaintiff by allowing the court to order the defendant to refrain from abusing the plaintiff's cat or dog.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **JUDICIARY BILLS**

**HOUSE 383** 

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) 386 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property and legal title and equitable estate, further providing for right to dispose of a decedent's remains. (Representatives READSHAW, BARBIN, KORTZ and others) - Rules, March 14, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code to provide for "majority rule" in decisions regarding the disposition of a decedent's remains.

**SENATE** 108

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in anatomical gifts, further providing for manner of executing anatomical gifts. (Senators SABATINA, VULAKOVICH, ARGALL and others) - Judiciary, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Chapter 86 of Title 20 to provide for candidates for organ transplants who are disabled.

**SENATE** 180

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property 1532 and legal title and equitable estate, further providing for right to dispose of a decedent's remains; in health care, further providing for example; in anatomical gifts, further providing for definitions, providing for scope, further providing for persons who may execute anatomical gift, for persons who may become donees and purposes for which anatomical gifts may be made, for manner of executing anatomical gifts, for rights and duties at death, for requests for anatomical gifts, for use of driver's license or identification card to indicate organ or tissue donation, for The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund contributions, for The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund, for confidentiality requirement and for prohibited activities, providing for promotion of organ and tissue donation, establishing the Donate Life PA Registry, providing for facilitation of anatomical gift from decedent whose death is under investigation, for collaboration among departments and organ procurement organizations, for requirements for physician and nurse training relative to organ and tissue donation and recovery, for Department of Transportation, for Department of Corrections, for study of organ procurement organizations and for relation to Electronic Signatures in Global and National **Commerce Act, repealing provisions relating to corneal transplants** and providing for vascularized composite allografts. (Senators GREENLEAF, ARGALL, YAW and others) - Judiciary, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Chapter 86 of Title 20 in order to amend various provisions regarding donations of human tissue and organs.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

HOUSE 1741 2338

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for authority to issue liquor licenses to hotels, restaurants and clubs, for sale of malt or brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases and sales and for premises to be vacated by patrons. (Representatives MARSHALL, MILLARD, MULLERY and others) – Liquor Control, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Title 47 to allow club license holders to sell six packs to their members.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE 641

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assessments of persons and property, providing for senior property tax freeze. (Representatives GROVE, SCHWEYER, JAMES and others) – Local Government, April 16, 2018

OVER

This bill establishes an Optional Senior Property Tax Freeze program.

HOUSE 1142 1365

An Act amending the act of December 18, 1984 (P.L.1005, No.205), known as the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and Recovery Act, in standards for municipal pension systems, further providing for definitions and providing for special procedures for certain professional services contracts. (Representatives BRIGGS AND GODSHALL) - Rules, December 12, 2017

OVER

This bill provides for definitions and providing for special procedures for certain professional services contracts.

**SENATE 403** 

1228

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in employees, further providing for commission members. (Senators BREWSTER, GREENLEAF, RESCHENTHALER and others) – Local Government, December 12, 2017

OVER

This bill amends Title 53 to remove the FBI from the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission and replaces them with a member of the State FOP.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILL

SENATE **892** 

An Act amending the act of December 16, 1986 (P.L.1646, No.188), known as the Chiropractic Practice Act, in licensure and regulation, further providing for license required. (Senators RESCHENTHALER, ARGALL, KILLION and others) - Professional Licensure, April 10, 2018

OVER

This bill authorizes students in chiropractic schools to perform chiropractic activities as part of their clinical training.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

**HOUSE** 

**28** 2006

An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in matters affecting government units, providing for exceptions to governmental immunity related to unauthorized aliens; and, in preemptions, providing for restriction on municipal regulation of official and employee communications relating to immigration status. (Representatives WHITE, PICKETT, A. HARRIS and others) - Rules, February 5, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Titles 42 and 53 define sanctuary municipalities, establish liability for damages, and set reporting requirements for public officials/employees/law enforcement.

SENATE 1034 1441

An Act amending the act of December 22, 2011 (P.L.598, No.131), known as the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011, in establishment of congressional districts, repealing provisions relating to congressional districts. (Senators SCARNATI AND CORMAN) - State Government, March 12, 2018

OVER

This bill repeals the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE 1446 3161

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in restructuring of electric utility industry, providing for transportation fueling infrastructure development. (Representatives M. QUINN, TAYLOR, BRIGGS and others) - Transportation, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Transportation Code and Public Utility Code to set statewide and regional goals for alternative energy vehicle refueling stations.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 1814

An Act amending the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L.1368, No.542), known as the Real Estate Tax Sale Law, in short title and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in sale of property, further providing for repurchase by owner and providing for limitation on trusteeship and for ownership interests and responsibilities of delinquent property owner. (Representatives M. K. KELLER, MASSER, D. COSTA and others) – Urban Affairs, February 6, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for repurchase by owner and providing for limitation on trusteeship and for ownership interests and responsibilities of delinquent property owner.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 1412 3120

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in restructuring of electric utility industry, providing for microgrid and energy storage. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BARBIN and others) - Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness, April 9, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for micro-grid pilot programs to be developed by electric utility companies, upon PUC approval.

**HOUSE 1835** 

1835 2548

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in grants to fire companies and emergency medical services companies, further providing for definitions, for award of grants and for requiring fire companies and emergency medical services companies to establish a social media policy in order to be eligible to receive grant funds. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BARBIN and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 24, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for social media policies for Fire and EMS Departments.

HOUSE 1836 2549

An Act authorizing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to join the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact; and providing for the form of the compact. (Representatives BARRAR, V. BROWN, P. COSTA and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 24, 2018

OVER

This bill establishes the Commonwealth participation in the Physical Therapists Compact, thereby allowing licensure reciprocity for military spouses that work in Pennsylvania.

This bill amends the Borough Code and the Third Class City Code to allow for concise publication of annual financial reports.
