OVER

This bill amends the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code to provide for "majority rule" in decisions regarding the disposition of a decedent's remains.

OVER

This bill requires agencies to appoint a regulatory compliance officer.

SENATE 1034 1441

An Act amending the act of December 22, 2011 (P.L.598, No.131), known as the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011, in establishment of congressional districts, repealing provisions relating to congressional districts. (Senators SCARNATI AND CORMAN) - State Government, March 12, 2018

OVER

This bill repeals the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011.



This bill provides for designation of certain State Routes as scenic byways.
