

(Representatives DAY, KNOWLES, D. COSTA and others) - Consumer Affairs, March 13, 2018 12

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to clarify the realty transfer tax exemption for veteran's organizations.

HOUSE 1401 2610 An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, providing for volumetric severance tax; and making a related repeal. (Representatives DiGIROLAMO, DeLISSIO, MURT and others) - Finance, May 22, 2018 1

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to provide a natural gas severance tax.

This bill Amends Title 34 to allow for possession of certain "pocket pets", including hedgehogs and sugar gliders.

An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing for trespass on private property while hunting. (Representatives B. MILLER, ZIMMERMAN, GODSHALL and others) - Game & Fisheries, May 22, 2018

This bill amends Title 34 to provide that the offense of Trespass while Hunting will be primary offense, and increasing penalties.





This bill provides for limited lines travel insurance.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS



This bill amends the Protection From Abuse Act to add another type of relief for the plaintiff by allowing the court to order the defendant to refrain from abusing the plaintiff's cat or dog.

This bill amends the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code to provide for "majority rule" in decisions regarding the disposition of a decedent's remains.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for authority to issue liquor licenses to hotels, restaurants and clubs, for sale of malt or brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases and sales and for premises to be vacated by patrons. (Representatives MARSHALL, MILLARD, MULLERY and others) - Liquor Control, April 9, 2018 10

This bill authorizes students in chiropractic schools to perform chiropractic activities as part of their clinical training.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2006 Statutes, in matters affecting government units, providing for exceptions to governmental immunity related to unauthorized aliens; and, in preemptions, providing for restriction on municipal regulation of official and employee communications relating to immigration status. (Representatives WHITE, PICKETT, A. HARRIS and others) - Rules, February 5, 2018 15

This bill amends Titles 42 and 53 define sanctuary municipalities, establish liability for damages, and set reporting requirements for public officials/employees/law enforcement.

HOUSE 466 3355 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in officers serving process and enforcing orders, further providing for powers and duties of the sheriff. 

This bill establishes the Commonwealth participation in the Physical Therapists Compact, thereby allowing licensure reciprocity for military spouses that work in Pennsylvania.


