OVER

This bill provides for Second Stage Loan Program.

(Representatives KAMPF, GODSHALL, McGINNIS and others) - Commerce, June 5, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for short title and scope of chapter and for appeals by taxing districts.

HOUSE 1284 3121

An Act providing for the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal within the Department of Community and Economic Development. (Representatives PEIFER, PICKETT, DRISCOLL and others) - Commerce, June 12, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal within the Department of Community and Economic Development; and establishing the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal Advisory Board.

HOUSE 2241 3290

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other subjects of taxation, providing for prohibited fees, surcharges and taxes; and making inconsistent repeals. (Representatives MUSTIO, GROVE, DIAMOND and others) - Commerce, May 22, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Title 53 to prohibit fees, surcharges and taxes for food and beverage, and food/beverage containers.

OVER

HOUSE 1603

OVER

This bill creates the Taxpayer-Funded Genera or Sex Reassignment Services Act.

HOUSE 1024 251

An Act amending the act of October 7, 2010 (P.L.484, No.70), known as the Adult Protective Services Act, in reporting suspected abuse by employees, providing for Statewide adult abuse registry. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BIZZARRO, BOBACK and others) - Human Services, April 18, 2018

OVER

This bill establishes a statewide adult abuse registry within the Department of Human Services.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

1286

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, in medical professional liability, providing for punitive damages study. (Representatives MENTZER, ZIMMERMAN, HICKERNELL and others) - Insurance, June 12, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for punitive damages study.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.789, No.285), known as The Insurance Department Act of 1921, providing for limited lines travel insurance. (Representatives PICKETT AND DeLUCA) - Rules, May 23 2018

OVER

This bill provides for limited lines travel insurance.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, further providing for relief. (Representatives MARSICO, READSHAW, KNOWLES and others) – Judiciary, May 24, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Protection From Abuse Act to add another type of relief for the plaintiff by allowing the court to order the defendant to refrain from abusing the plaintiff's cat or dog.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **JUDICIARY BILLS**

HOUSE 383

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) 386 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property and legal title and equitable estate, further providing for right to dispose of a decedent's remains. (Representatives READSHAW, BARBIN, KORTZ and others) - Rules, June 6, 2018

OVER

This bill amends the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code to provide for "majority rule" in decisions regarding the disposition of a decedent's remains.

SENATE 461

An Act amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in DNA data and testing, further providing 1026 for policy, for definitions, for powers and duties of State Police, for State DNA Data Base, for State DNA Data Bank, for State Police recommendation of additional offenses, for procedural compatibility with FBI and for DNA sample required upon conviction, delinquency adjudication and certain ARD cases, providing for collection from persons accepted from other jurisdictions and further providing for procedures for withdrawal, collection and transmission of DNA samples, for procedures for conduct, disposition and use of DNA analysis, for DNA data base exchange and for expungement. (Senators KILLION, BOSCOLA, BREWSTER and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2018



SENATE 554

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1823 Statutes, in human trafficking, further providing for definitions, repealing provisions relating to appropriate implementation for minor victims of human trafficking, providing for special relief to restore victim's dignity and autonomy and for safe harbor for sexually exploited children, establishing the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund and imposing penalties; and, in juvenile matters, providing for dependency in lieu of delinquency. (Senators GREENLEAF, LEACH, BREWSTER and others) - Judiciary, June 11, 2018

VOTE



This bill amends Title 18 to establish a Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children.

SENATE

An Act providing for the disposal of hospice or home health care 1860 patient medication. (Senators BAKER, FONTANA, ARGALL and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2018

VOTE

This bill establishes the freestanding Hospice and Home Health Prescription Medication Disposal Act.




SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

SENATE 1090

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in offenses involving danger to the person, providing for antihazing and prescribing penalties; in minors, further providing for purchase, consumption, possession or transportation of liquor or malt or brewed beverages and providing for safe harbor for violation of section 6308(a); in forfeiture of assets, further providing for asset forfeiture; and making a related repeal. (Senators CORMAN, GORDNER, LANGERHOLC and others) – Judiciary, June 11, 2018

VOTE



This bill repeals the Antihazing Law and adds a new Chapter 28 to Title 18 which provides for new criminal offenses, penalties, reporting requirements, and immunities related to hazing.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 1840 3595

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in liability and compensation, further providing for schedule of compensation and for physical examination or expert interview. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, EVERETT, PICKETT and others) - Labor & Industry, June 12, 2018

OVER

This bill re-enacts a provision in the Workers' Compensation Act authorizing Impairment Rating Evaluations with changes to comply with the PA Supreme Court's ruling in Protz v. WCAB.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

HOUSE 1741 2338

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for authority to issue liquor licenses to hotels, restaurants and clubs, for sale of malt or brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases and sales and for premises to be vacated by patrons. (Representatives MARSHALL, MILLARD, MULLERY and others) – Liquor Control, June 11, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Title 47 to allow club license holders to sell six packs to their members.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS**

HOUSE 641

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assessments of persons and 1712 property, providing for senior property tax freeze. (Representatives GROVE, SCHWEYER, JAMES and others) - Local Government, June 18, 2018

OVER

This bill establishes an Optional Senior Property Tax Freeze program.

HOUSE 1142

An Act amending the act of December 18, 1984 (P.L.1005, No.205), known as the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard 1365 and Recovery Act, in standards for municipal pension systems, further providing for definitions and providing for special procedures for certain professional services (Representatives BRIGGS AND GODSHALL) - Rules, April 17, 2018

OVER

This bill provides for definitions and providing for special procedures for certain professional services contracts.

SENATE 403

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in employees, further providing 1228 for commission members. (Senators BREWSTER, GREENLEAF, RESCHENTHALER and others) - Local Government, April 17, 2018

OVER


This bill amends Title 53 to remove the FBI from the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission and replaces them with a member of the State FOP.

SENATE 530

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and 1166 Professional Counselors Act, further providing for definitions, for qualifications for license, for reciprocity, for restriction on the use of title "licensed clinical social worker," for restrictions on the use of title "Licensed Professional Counselor," for penalties and for unlawful practice; and repealing provisions related to appropriation. (Senators KILLION, BLAKE, ARGALL and others) - Professional Licensure, June 13, 2018 2

VOTE



This bill provides for qualifications for license.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

SENATE 764

An Act amending the act of December 22, 1983 (P.L.306, No.84), known as the Board of Vehicles Act, providing for preliminary provisions, further providing for short title, for definitions, for State **Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers and Salespersons, for** powers and duties of board, for license to engage in business, for biennial renewal, for enforcement, for protest hearing decision within 120 days unless waived by the parties, for reimbursement for all parts and service required by the manufacturer or distributor and reimbursement audits, for damage disclosure, for mediation and arbitration, for unlawful acts by manufacturers or distributors, for area of responsibility, for termination of franchises, for industry reorganization, for succession to franchise ownership, for manufacturer right of first refusal, for manufacturer or distributor repurchase of inventory and equipment, for reimbursement of rental costs for dealer facility, for grounds for disciplinary proceedings, for administrative liability of employer, copartnership, association or corporation, for reinstatement, for application for license, for refusal of license, for change of salesperson's license to indicate new employer, for termination of employment or business, for exemption from licensure and registration, for limitations on establishing or relocating dealers, for licensing cost, for penalties, for civil actions for violations, for fees, for disposition of fees and fines, for vehicle shows, off-premise sales and exhibitions and for off-premise sales, shows, exhibitions or rallies on Sundays; providing for recreational vehicles and for miscellaneous provisions; further providing for savings provision, for repeals, expiration of terms of board members and for existing rules and regulations. OVER

This bill amends the Board of Vehicles Act to consolidate the provisions regarding the recreational vehicle industry and reorganize them into a new chapter.

An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2006 Statutes, in matters affecting government units, providing for exceptions to governmental immunity related to unauthorized aliens; and, in preemptions, providing for restriction on municipal regulation of official and employee communications relating to immigration status. (Representatives WHITE, PICKETT, A. HARRIS and others) - Rules, May 23, 2018

OVER

This bill amends Titles 42 and 53 define sanctuary municipalities, establish liability for damages, and set reporting requirements for public officials/employees/law enforcement.

HOUSE An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) 466 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in officers serving process and enforcing orders, further providing for powers and duties of the sheriff. (Representatives CHRISTIANA, D. COSTA, BARRAR OVER and others) - Rules, June 13, 2018 This bill amends the Sunshine Act to require increased publication of meeting agendas before public meetings and to preclude agencies from taking official action on matters that the agency does not list on the agenda. HOUSE An Act providing for an inventory of State-owned assets for the development of mobile broadband services in unserved areas and underserved areas of this Commonwealth. (Representatives PHILLIPS-HILL, SNYDER, BIZZARRO and others) - State OVER Government, May 1, 2018 12 This bill directs the Department of General Services to conduct an inventory of existing state owned communications assets. **SENATE** An Act amending the act of December 22, 2011 (P.L.598, 1034 No.131), known as the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011, in establishment of congressional districts, repealing provisions relating congressional districts. (Senators SCARNATI OVER CORMAN) - State Government, June 4, 2018 This bill repeals the Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011. SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL **HOUSE** An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in restructuring of electric utility industry, providing for transportation fueling infrastructure development. (Representatives M. OUINN, TAYLOR, BRIGGS and OVER others) - Transportation, June 11, 2018

This bill amends the Transportation Code and Public Utility Code to set statewide and regional goals for alternative energy vehicle refueling stations.

HOUSE 1835

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in grants to fire companies and emergency medical services companies, further providing for definitions, for award of grants and for requiring fire companies and emergency medical services companies to establish a social media policy in order to be eligible to receive grant funds.
