SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

370

An Act amending the act of June 30, 1981 (P.L.128, No.43), known as the Agricultural Area Security Law, further providing for purchase of agricultural conservation easements. (Representatives KLUNK, MOUL, RYAN and others) – Agriculture & Rural Affairs, March 13, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the Agricultural Area Security Law to provide for restrictions, limitations and subdivision on preserved farmland.

HOUSE

404

An Act amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in controlled plants and noxious weeds, further providing for noxious weed list. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, PASHINSKI and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, March 13, 2019

VOTE



This bill adds Tree of Heaven to the noxious weed list.

HOUSE

441

An Act amending the act of June 30, 1981 (P.L.128, No.43), known as the Agricultural Area Security Law, further providing for definitions and for purchase of agricultural conservation easements. (Representatives SONNEY, CIRESI, FREEMAN and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, March 13, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the Agricultural Area Security Law to provide for wind power generation system on preserved farmland.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, March 12, 2019

VOTE

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in property and buildings, further providing for price paid for acquisitions and improvements. (Representatives TURZAI, GILLESPIE, KORTZ and others) – Game & Fisheries, March 13, 2019



This bill amends Title 34 to remove the current price per acre restriction on Game Fund money used for the purchase of land to be used as game lands in a county of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILLS

HOUSE 131

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for malt and brewed beverages manufacturers', distributors' and importing distributors' licenses and for breweries; in distilleries, wineries, bonded warehouses, bailees for hire and transporters for hire, further providing for limited wineries and for distilleries; and, in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for construction and applicability. (Representatives JOZWIAK, GREINER, BARRAR and others) - Liquor Control, March 13, 2019



This bill amends the act of April 12, 1951, known as the Liquor Code, to modify the definition of "alcoholic cider" to be products made using juice from only apples and pears.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILLS

325

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in distilleries, wineries, bonded warehouses, bailees for hire and transporters for hire, establishing the Pennsylvania Distilled Spirits Industry Promotion Board. (Representatives DEASY, READSHAW, HILL-EVANS and others) - Liquor Control, March 13, 2019

C VOTE

This bill amends the act of April 12, 1951, known as the Liquor Code, to create the Pennsylvania Distilled Spirits Promotion Board.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE 374

An Act amending Titles 27 (Environmental Resources) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Keystone Tree Fund; and, in registration of vehicles, providing for contributions to the Keystone Tree Fund. (Representatives EVERETT, SOLOMON, PASHINSKI and others) – Transportation, February 21, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 27 & 75 to provide for Keystone Tree Fund.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 324

An Act amending Title 72 (Taxation and Fiscal Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, establishing microenterprise loan programs and abating real property assessment. (Representatives GILLESPIE, SCHLOSSBERG, RABB and others) – Urban Affairs, March 13, 2019



This bill establishes the microenterprise loan program, with the goal of offering municipalities an additional economic development and revitalization tool that address unemployment through the advancement of microenterprises developed via public-private partnerships.
