SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, March 12, 2019

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, March 25, 2019 4

OVER

This bill amend Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **HEALTH BILL**

HOUSE 427

An Act providing for health insurance coverage requirements for stage four, advanced metastatic cancer. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Health, April 8, 2019

OVER

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 279

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and immunities, providing for rescue from motor vehicle. (Representatives BOBACK, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Judiciary, April 8, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends the Judicial Code to provide civil immunity for entering a motor vehicle in order to rescue an individual.

HOUSE **288**

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in offenses against the family, 261 further providing for the offense of concealing death of child. (Representatives SIMMONS, BOBACK, TOOHIL and others) - Judiciary, April 8, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the Crimes Code to increase the penalty for concealing the death of a child.

HOUSE 315

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sexual offenses, providing 295 for the offense of female mutilation. (Representatives MURT, BULLOCK, RABB and others) - Judiciary, April 8, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends Title 18 by adding a section prohibiting the act of female mutilation.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILLS

HOUSE 422

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), 1088 known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in training and certification of inspectors, further providing for training of inspectors. (Representatives DELOZIER, ROTHMAN, M. K. KELLER and others) - Labor & Industry, April 8, 2019



This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to allow the Department of Labor & Industry to create a separate "on-the-job" trainee classification for each building code official certification.

HOUSE **785**

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for 856 definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, March 20,

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 223

An Act authorizing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission and the Governor, to grant and convey to French Azilum, Inc., certain lands situate in Asylum Township, Bradford County. (Representative PICKETT) - State Government, April 08, 2019



This bill authorizes the conveyance of land in Asylum Township, Bradford County.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE **374**

An Act amending Titles 27 (Environmental Resources) and 75 347 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Keystone Tree Fund: and in marine. **Keystone Tree Fund; and, in registration of vehicles, providing for** contributions to the Keystone Tree Fund. (Representatives EVERETT, SOLOMON, PASHINSKI and others) - Transportation, February 21, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 27 & 75 to provide for Keystone Tree Fund.

THIRD CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

HOUSE **538**

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives FLYNN, BERNSTINE, SCHLOSSBERG and others) – Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill provides for Olympics Income Tax exemption.

THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

328

An Act establishing the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance

Task Force. (Representatives WARREN, STRUZZI, MURT and others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill establishes the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance Task Force.

HOUSE 30

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in anatomical gifts, further providing for The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund contributions. (Representatives PETRARCA, MURT, NEILSON and others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends Title 20 to increase the optional donation amount by vehicle registrants to The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund.
