SECOND CONSIDERATION AGING AND OLDER ADULT SERVICES BILLS

HOUSE **684**

An Act amending the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, in pharmaceutical assistance for the elderly, further providing for the definition of "income." (Representatives SONNEY, BERNSTINE, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Aging & Older Adult Services, April 09, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the act of August 26, 1971, known as the State Lottery Law, in pharmaceutical assistance for the elderly, further providing for the definition of "income".

HOUSE **754**

An Act amending the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, in pharmaceutical assistance for the elderly, further providing for determination of eligibility. (Representatives THOMAS, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Aging & Older Adult Services, April 09, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the act of August 26, 1971, known as the State Lottery Law, in pharmaceutical assistance for the elderly, further providing for determination of eligibility.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

HOUSE 309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, March 12, 2019

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, March 25, 2019 5

OVER

This bill amend Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

HOUSE 24

An Act amending the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, in capital facilities, further providing for bonds, issue of bonds and notes, maturity and interest. (Representatives LAWRENCE, TURZAI, BERNSTINE and others) - Finance, April 9, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act to require new issuances of state debt to be repaid in equal amounts over the term of the bond.

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in inheritance tax, further providing for inheritance tax rate. (Representatives METZGAR, DUNBAR, RADER and others) – Finance, April 09, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to eliminate Inheritance Tax for children under the age of 21.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **HEALTH BILLS**

HOUSE 427

An Act providing for health insurance coverage requirements for stage four, advanced metastatic cancer. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Health, April 8, 2019

OVER

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

HOUSE 629

An Act providing for patient access to diagnostics and treatments for Lyme disease and related tick-borne illnesses; and requiring health care policies to provide certain coverage. (Representatives RAPP, KAUFFMAN, BOROWICZ and others) - Health, April 9, 2019

VOTE



This bill is a freestanding act which addresses antibiotic treatment for Lyme disease and related tick-borne illnesses.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE

962

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time, further providing for six months limitation, for infancy, insanity or imprisonment, for no limitation applicable and for other offenses; and, in matters affecting government units, further providing for exceptions to sovereign immunity, for limitations on damages in actions against Commonwealth parties, for exceptions to governmental immunity and for limitations on damages in actions against local parties. (Representatives ROZZI, GREGORY, AND BRIGGS) - Judiciary, April 09, 2019



This bill provides for waivers of sovereign and governmental immunity relating to claims of childhood sexual abuse.

HOUSE

963

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for courts 1130 to be open and suits against the Commonwealth. (Representatives GREGORY AND ROZZI) - Judiciary, April 09, 2019



This bill provides for a two-year window in which civil lawsuits alleging childhood sexual abuse may be filed in court notwithstanding any otherwise applicable statute of limitations defense.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 785

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, March 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE 374

An Act amending Titles 27 (Environmental Resources) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Keystone Tree Fund; and, in registration of vehicles, providing for contributions to the Keystone Tree Fund. (Representatives EVERETT, SOLOMON, PASHINSKI and others) – Transportation, February 21, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 27 & 75 to provide for Keystone Tree Fund.

THIRD CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

HOUSE **538**

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives FLYNN, BERNSTINE, SCHLOSSBERG and others) – Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill provides for Olympics Income Tax exemption.

THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

328

An Act establishing the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance
Task Force. (Representatives WARREN, STRUZZI, MURT and others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill establishes the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance Task Force.

others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note

OVER

This bill amends Title 20 to increase the optional donation amount by vehicle registrants to The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund.
