#### SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

**309** 

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, March 12, 2019

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

**1005E 247** 

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, March 25, 2019 6

**OVER** 

This bill amend Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **FINANCE BILL**

HOUSE 880

An Act amending the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, in capital 991 facilities, further providing for appropriation for and limitation on redevelopment assistance capital projects. (Representatives LEWIS, TURZAI, KAUFFMAN and others) - Finance, April 10, 2019



This bill provides for redevelopment Assistance Capital Projects Debt Ceiling: \$100 Million Decrease.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** GAME AND FISHERIES BILL

HOUSE 808

An Act amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, providing for power to set fees; in fiscal affairs, further providing for collection fee for uncollectible checks; in fishing licenses, further providing for nonresident and tourist licenses, for one-day resident fishing license, for license, permit and issuing agent fees and for license and permit packaging options; in special licenses and permits, further providing for net permits, for boat and net licenses for boundary lakes, for permits for protection and management of particular fish, for permits for the use of explosives, for Lake Erie fishing permits and for fishing guide and charter boat permits; in regulated fishing lakes, further providing for licenses and for fees: in dams, bar racks and migration devices, further providing for obstructing migration of fish; in preliminary provisions, further providing for fees; and, in registration and titling of boats, further providing for issuing agents, for fees and for notice for boats and related equipment. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, MURT, KULIK and others) - Game & Fisheries, April 10, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends Title 30 to grant the Fish and Boat Commission the authority to set license and permit fees by regulation under specific guidelines, including legislative oversight and a sunset provision.

## **SECOND CONSIDERATION** HEALTH BILL

**HOUSE 427** 1089

An Act providing for health insurance coverage requirements for stage four, advanced metastatic cancer. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Health, April

OVER

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE 854** 

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses), 23 (Domestic Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of stalking; in wiretapping and electronic surveillance, further providing for definitions; in child custody, further providing for consideration of criminal conviction; in domestic and sexual violence victim address confidentiality, further providing for penalties; and, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for second and subsequent offenses. (Representatives ECKER, McCLINTON, MOUL and others) – Judiciary, April 10,

VOTE

This bill provides for the offense of strangulation.

HOUSE **991** 

An Act amending the act of July 8, 1978 (P.L.752, No.140), known as the Public Employee Pension Forfeiture Act, further providing for definitions. (Representatives THOMAS, TOEPEL, ROTHMAN and others) – Judiciary, April 10, 2019



This bill amends the Public Employee Pension Forfeiture Act to establish that the provision relating to committing sex offenses applies to all public employees and public officials.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

**HOUSE 785** 

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) – Labor & Industry, March 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

HOUSE 763

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), 1328 known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for authority to issue liquor licenses to hotels, restaurants and clubs, for sales by liquor licensees and restrictions, for sale of malt or brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases and sales, for unlawful acts relative to malt or brewed beverages and licensees and for premises to be vacated by patrons. (Representatives O'NEAL, PYLE, ROTHMAN and others) - Liquor Control, April 10, 2019



This bill provides for permit clubs to sell beer for off-premise consumption.

### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

**HOUSE** 103

An Act amending the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805, No.247), 102 known as the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, in subdivision and land development, providing for nonbuilding lots. (Representatives MALONEY, MOUL, ROTHMAN and others) - Local Government, April 10, 2019



This bill amends the MPC to mandate that all subdivision and land development ordinances contain provisions pertaining to the creation of Non-Building Lots.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

**HOUSE 374** 

An Act amending Titles 27 (Environmental Resources) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for 347 Keystone Tree Fund; and, in registration of vehicles, providing for contributions to the Keystone Tree Fund. (Representatives EVERETT, SOLOMON, PASHINSKI and others) - Transportation, February 21, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 27 & 75 to provide for Keystone Tree Fund.

#### THIRD CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

**HOUSE 538** 

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives FLYNN, BERNSTINE, SCHLOSSBERG and others) – Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

**OVER** 

This bill provides for Olympics Income Tax exemption.

#### THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

**328** 

An Act establishing the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance

Task Force. (Representatives WARREN, STRUZZI, MURT and others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

**OVER** 

This bill establishes the Flood Insurance Premium Assistance Task Force.

#### THIRD CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE 30

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in anatomical gifts, further providing for The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund contributions. (Representatives PETRARCA, MURT, NEILSON and others) - Appropriations, March 27, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends Title 20 to increase the optional donation amount by vehicle registrants to The Governor Robert P. Casey Memorial Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Trust Fund.

HOUSE 104

A Resolution directing the Secretary of Revenue and the Governor to commence negotiations with the State of New York's Governor and Commissioner of the Department of Taxation and Finance to effectuate an income tax reciprocity agreement between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New York.
