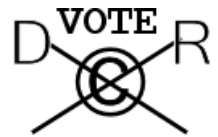

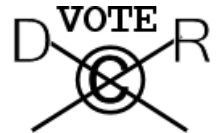


This bill amends the Public School Code by updating outdated terminology to conform with modern usage.
