HOUSE 1184 1370 An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, in general budget implementation, providing for block grants and further providing for Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency. (Representative SAYLOR) - Appropriations, May 14, 2019 1



This bill amends the Fiscal Code to provide for block grants and further provide for Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency.

SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS




An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) – Agriculture & Rural Affairs, May 14, 2019 1



This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, April 30, 2019 7

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL


An Act amending the act of June 27, 1991 (P.L.70, No.10), entitled "An act requiring the superintendent of every public school district to make available, upon request, lists of graduating seniors to armed forces recruiters; and providing a penalty for the misuse of any such lists," further providing for title and for legislative intent; providing for short title and for definitions; and further providing for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs. (Representatives READSHAW, MURT, JAMES and others) - Education, May 13, 2019 2

HOUSE An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania 102 Consolidated Statutes, in hunting and furtaking licenses, further 101 providing for eligibility for license. (Representatives MALONEY, BERNSTINE, IRVIN and others) - Game & Fisheries, May 14, 2019

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE An Act providing for health insurance coverage requirements 427 for stage four, advanced metastatic cancer. (Representatives 1089 BENNINGHOFF, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Health, April 8, 2019

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four; advanced metastatic cancer.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **JUDICIARY BILL**

HOUSE A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and 1630 adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, (Representatives SIMS and others) - Judiciary, May 06, 2019 5

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), 856 known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, May 8, 2019

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, 1614 providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, May 1. 2019 6

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS**

An Act amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700. No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, further providing for 843 definitions; and providing for pharmacy technician and pharmacy technician trainee registration, qualifications and supervision. (Representatives DeLUCA, MILLARD, HILL-EVANS and others) - Professional Licensure, May 14, 2019 1

This bill requires pharmacy technicians to be registered with the State Board of Pharmacy.

An Act amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee 1781 to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the **Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and further** providing for civil penalties and license suspension," providing for licensure by endorsement. (Representatives HICKERNELL, READSHAW, CAUSER and others) - Professional Licensure, May 14, 2019

This bill requires the licensing boards and commissions under the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs to provide licensure by endorsement for applicants who hold similar licenses in other states.

This bill amends the Public School Code by updating outdated terminology to conform with modern usage.

An Act amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, in contributions by employers and employees, further providing for relief from charges.
