(Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - **Children & Youth, April 30, 2019** **13**

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

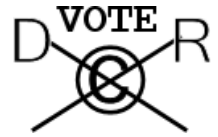

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to provide a Realty Transfer Tax exemption for a first responders' surviving spouse or children.

(Representatives COX, BERNSTINE, BROWN and others) - **Health, June 5, 2019** 1



This bill amends the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program Act to include the administration of naloxone in a patient's record on the ABC-MAP database.

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.
